AT the Court at *Balmoral*, the 24th day of September, 1855,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," and of the third section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the second and third years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, in the words following; viz.:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent that having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Cheshunt, in the county of Hertford and in the diocese of Rochester, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity, situate at Waltham Cross, in the said parish of Cheshunt, under the power for this purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes,' and in the third section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the second and third years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the assignment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes,' and that such proposed district should be named 'the District Chapelry of the Holy Trinity Waltham Cross,' and that the boundaries thereof should be those hereinafter mentioned; that is to say: by a

line commencing at the junction of the ride from Theobald's-park Farm with Theobald's-lane, and proceeding in an easterly direction along the middle of that lane to Love-lane, then along the middle of Love-lane, in a northerly direction, as far as Albury Ride, then proceeding easterly along the middle of that ride as far as the Turnpike-road, and crossing over the same to Russell's Ride, then proceeding along the middle of that ride, as far as the Northern and Eastern Railway, which said railway it crosses in a straight line to a hedge, and proceeding along such hedge easterly, for about two hundred and eighty-six yards, then proceeding northerly along another hedge for about one hundred and sixty-five yards to its junction with the small Lea River, then south-easterly along the middle of that river for about one hundred and thirty-six yards to a hedge, and then northerly along such hedge to the navigation, then crossing the said navigation, and proceeding along a watercourse across Cheshunt Marsh to its junction with the Old River Lea, then along the said River Lea, and the boundary line of the parish of Waltham Holy Cross, in the county of Essex, in a southerly direction as far as the parish of Enfield, then proceeding westerly along the boundary line, separating the parish of Cheshunt from the parish of Enfield, as far as a hedge leading in a straight line north-easterly to the ride to Theobald's-park Farm, then proceeding along such hedge, and northerly along the middle of that ride to the point where the boundary line commenced, as such District Chapelry is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereto annexed, and is thereon coloured green.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent that it appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings, should be solemnized or performed at Holy Trinity Church, at Waltham Cross aforesaid, and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the Incumbent of such church for the time being.

"That the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Acts and sections hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect

thereto as to your Majesty, in your royal wisdom, shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment of a particular district to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity, situate at Waltham Cross, in the parish of Cheshunt be accordingly made, and that the recommendations of the said Commissioners in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, and churchings, in the said church, and the fees to arise therefrom, be carried into effect agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Rochester.

AT the Court at *Balmoral*, the 24th day of *September*, 1855,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned, ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament, held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in any of the undermentioned parishes without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with the following modifications;

GAINSBOROUGH.—Forthwith within three yards of all dwelling houses in *Holy Trinity Churchyard*, in the parish of Gainsborough, and that except in family vaults and graves only one body be buried in each grave; forthwith within three yards of all dwelling houses and of the west boundary wall in the *Friends' Burial-ground*; and from and after the first September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, in the *Parish Churchyard*.

WRAWBY, LINCOLNSHIRE.—Forthwith in the *Parish Church* of Wrawby, and in the *Independent Chapel*, Brigg, in the same parish; and from and after the first September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, in the parish churchyard and in the *Independent Chapel Burial-ground*.

ALFORD, LINCOLNSHIRE.—Forthwith in the *Parish Church* and in the *Old Churchyard*, Alford, and in the *Independent Chapel*, Alford; in the Cemetery, within three yards of dwelling-houses, and in the *Independent Chapel Burial-ground* within three yards of the chapel.

KNARESBOROUGH.—Forthwith in *Knareborough Church* and also in the *Churchyard*, except in now existing vaults and walled graves which can be opened without disturbing soil which has been buried in, and in which each coffin shall be embedded in powdered charcoal and separately entombed, and in family graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the disturbance of remains, and in graves which have never been previously opened, in which one body only shall be buried; also forthwith in the *Independent Chapel* and burial-ground.

WHITTLESEY.—Forthwith in *St. Mary's Church*, and from and after the first January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, in the *Old Churchyard*, and that the *New Burial-ground* be drained to the depth of six feet and a half, at the least; forthwith in *St. Andrew's Church*, and from and after the first January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, in *St. Andrew's Churchyard*, and in the burial-grounds of the *Independent* and *Baptist Chapels*, in the parish of *St. Andrew*.

TWICKENHAM.—Forthwith in the *Parish Church* of Twickenham, and also in the churchyard and *Old Burial-ground*; and that in the *New Burial-ground*, except in family vaults and graves, only one body be buried in each grave.

BLECHINGLEY.—Forthwith in the *Parish Church*, and from and after the first September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six in the churchyard.

CHESTERFIELD.—Forthwith in the *Parish Church* of Chesterfield, in *Holy Trinity Church*, and in the *Independent* and *Wesleyan Chapels*; and from and after the first January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, in the *Parish Churchyard*, except in now existing walled graves, which can be opened without the disturbance of soil which has been buried in, for the burial of the husbands, wives, parents, or unmarried children of those previously buried therein, every coffin to be embedded in powdered charcoal and separately entombed in an air-tight manner; also forthwith in *Holy Trinity Churchyard* except so far as is compatible with the observance of the regulations for new burial-grounds.

WALSALL.—From and after the first of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, in the *Parish Churchyard* of *St. Matthew*, and in the *Parish Burial-ground* in *Bath-street*, except in now existing vaults, which can be opened without the disturbance of soil which has been buried in, and in which each coffin shall be embedded in powdered charcoal and separately entombed in an air-tight manner; and forthwith in the *Churchyard* of *St. Peters*, and in the *Roman Catholic Burial-ground*, Walsall, except in now existing vaults, used with the above-mentioned precautions, and in graves subject to the observance of the following regulations, viz.:—1st. That no coffin be placed in any grave or vault in which water accumulates. 2nd. That no new grave be formed within half a yard of any other grave or less than five feet and a half deep. 3rd. That no grave be re-opened except now existing family graves, which can be opened without the exposure of remains.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representa-

tion, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the tenth day of November next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before the said tenth day of November.
