WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of the Church Building Acts," as enlarged or extended by the nineteenth and twentieth sections of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the Church Building Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the thirteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, in the words following; viz.:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent that having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parishes of Herstmonceux, Warbleton, Wartling, and Dallington, in the county of Sussex, and in the diocese of Chichester, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate certain contiguous portions of the said parishes, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, for the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Bodle-street Green, in the said parish of Herstmonceux, under and by virtue of the power or authority contained in the ninth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act for the further amendment of the Church Building Acts,' as enlarged or extended by the nineteenth and twentieth sections of an Act passed in the session of Parliament, holden in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to amend the Church Building Acts,' and that such proposed consolidated chapelry should be named or called 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Bodle-street Green,' and that the boundaries thereof should be those hereinafter mentioned; that is to say:

"Commencing at the point where the boundary of the parishes of Warbleton and Dallington meet immediately adjacent to Groveley Farm, then following the said boundary line of the said parishes of Warbleton and Dallington easterly as far as Hovers Farm, then turning southerly past Pear Tree Farm, until the boundary of Warbleton parish approaches Prinkle and enters Wartling, and proceeding south-easterly along the north fence of the field marked A on the plan hereto annexed, and including within the said con-

solidated chapelry the house and offices of Prinkle, then crossing the lane westerly to the eastern fence of the field marked B as aforesaid, then proceeding southerly and westerly along the east and south fences of that field until it meets the boundary of the parish of Herstmonceux, then following the boundary of such last-named parish southerly until it reaches Five Bells River, and following the course of that river, first turning northerly and then westerly, until it reaches the road near Chilshams, then turning south-westerly along the road (passing Chilshams) until it meets the boundary line of a detached portion of the parish of Wartling, then following that boundary line south-westerly, passing through Stunts Green and across Featherbed-lane, continuing along such boundary line in a northerly direction towards Crall Farm, then returning easterly and returning southerly and south-easterly towards Studdings, and again turning northerly until it meets the boundary of the parish of Dallington to Ker River, then following the boundary of the parish of Dallington northerly until it approaches Batsford, where it turns into the parish of Warbleton, and follows the western fence of the field marked D as aforesaid (so as to include the farmhouse and offices of Batsford within the said consolidated chapelry), then turning easterly along the lane until it reaches the road, where it turns northerly and follows such road until it approaches Iwood, where it leaves the road and takes the western fence of the field marked E as aforesaid (so as to include the farmhouse and offices of Iwood within the said consolidated chapelry), it then again enters the road northerly until it reaches the cross roads where, turning easterly for a few yards, it proceeds northerly along the western fences of the field marked F as aforesaid, then easterly along the northern fence of the same field, then northerly along the western fence of the field marked G as aforesaid, then easterly along the northern fence of the same field, and following the northern fences of the fields marked H and I as aforesaid until they reach the river, then following the course of the river northerly until it emerges from the wood marked K as aforesaid, where it turns north-easterly along the north-western fences of the fields marked L and M as aforesaid, and passing round the house and offices of Grovely meets the boundary of the two parishes of Warbleton and Dallington at the point where the boundary line of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Bodle-street Green, commenced, and as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereto annexed, and is thereon coloured blue, green, pink, and yellow.

"That the consents of the Right Reverend Ashurst Turner, Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester, of John Jones, of Ruckley Grange, in the county of Salop, Esquire, patron of the parish church of the said parish of Herstmonceux, of the Reverend George Edward Haviland, of Warbleton aforesaid, Clerk, patron (in his own right) of the parish church of the said parish of Warbleton, and of the Reverend Thomas Nattle Grigg, of Wartling aforesaid, Clerk, patron (in his own right) of the parish church of the said parish of Wartling (being a majority of the patrons of the said respective parishes of Herstmonceux, Warbleton, Wartling, and Dallington), have been severally obtained to the formation of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Bodle-street Green, as required by the Act and section lastly hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this representation.
