THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Stockholm, enclosing copy of a translation of a Proclamation of the Swedish Board of Admiralty, announcing the discovery of a shoal in the Baltic, off the coast of the island of Oland; a copy of which is herewith subjoined.

(Translation.)

THE Royal Swedish Admiralty Board hereby report, for the information of mariners, that a shoal has been discovered, the shallowest point of which is 16 feet deep, N. 13 deg. 45 m. E. (corrected compass) $7\frac{1}{2}$ latitudinal minutes' distance from the Northern Lighthouse of Oland.

The bottom of the shoal consists of stone, in level strata, with abrupt edges. The shallowest part (16 feet), about 100 ells (a Swedish ell is about 2 English feet) long, forms the northern edge of the shoal, from which it stretches itself S. 20 deg. for 4 cable lengths about 3, 4, and 5 fathoms' depth, after which the depth increases with a series of regular shelves, but on the N.N.E., N.W., and S.W. sides the depth increases abruptly, and the bottom can hardly be found on those sides.

From the above shoal Oland Northern Lighthouse lies S. $26\frac{1}{2}$ deg. W. Jungfruns Western Point, S. 53 deg. W. Hunö Bôte, N. 62 deg. W. upon the compass.

Conditions of the sale of the Russian ship Sitka, condemned by a Decree of the Imperial Prize Court, dated the 5th June, 1855, and of her cargo:

ART. 1.—The sale will take place at Cherbourg.

The sale to be public, by open auction, on the 15th November, 1855, and on the following days, at ten o'clock A.M., at the Custom House Warehouse, under the management of the Commissaire aux Armements et Prises of the port of Cherbourg, and in the presence of the Principal Receiver of Customs and of Marine Inscription.

ART. 2.—The Russian ship Sitka, with her masts, rigging, and furniture, will be sold in one lot, and the sum at which she is put up will be fixed by the Commissaire aux Armements.

The biddings for this lot are not to be of a less amount than one hundred francs.

ART. 3.—Such persons as may wish to bid, can, up to the day of the sale, take cognizance of the inventory of the ship and of her cargo, at the Office of Armements, at Cherbourg.
