boundary line, separating the said parish of Tamworth from Haunton and Harlaston Lordship, until it reaches the parish of Elford; then westerly, southerly, and south-westerly along the boundary line, separating the said parish of Tamworth from the said parish of Elford as far as the River Tame; then proceeds south-westerly along the middle of that river to the point where the Trent Valley Railway crosses the same, and then proceeds south-easterly along the middle of that railway as far as Windmill-lane; then northeasterly along the middle of Windmill-lane into the turnpike-road leading from Tamworth to Burton-upon-Trent, and proceeds south-easterly along the middle of such turnpike-road to the junction of the same with the road leading to Ashby-de-la-Zouch, at the point where the boundary line of the said district chapelry of Wigginton commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map hereto annexed and is thereon coloured yellow.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of matrimony should continue to be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should continue to be solemnized or performed in Saint Leonard's Church at Wigginton aforesaid, and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the minister or incumbent of such church for the time being.

"That the consent of the said John, Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield, has been obtained thereto, as required by the two Acts and sections lastly hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof he has signed and scaled this representation.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the consolidated chapelry therein mentioned for the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity at WILNECOTE, in the parish of Tamworth, be accordingly formed, and that the agreement mentioned in the said representation in respect of the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts, and that the right of presentation and nomination to the said church shall be vested in, belong to, and, whenever occasion may require, be exercised by, the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the parish church of the said parish of Tamworth, he being the person named in such agreement; and it is further ordered, that the proposed assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Leonard at Wiggin-TON, in the said parish of Tamworth, be accordingly made, and that the recommendations of the said Commissioners in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, in the said church of Saint Leonard, and the fees to arise therefrom, be carried into effect agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the several dioceses of Lichfield and Worcester.
