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Naples, OCtob. 15.

THe Gallies of the Great Duke of Tufcany, which feqved againft the Thrks this Summer, arrived the laft week at Poztuolo; the Admiral Gurdf, accompanied with his principal Officers, cane athore to vifit qur Vice-Roy the Marquis del Carpso, wiich his Excellency returned, and made him a Prefent of frefh Provifions; The 13 th theie Gallies failed again for Leghorne. The Pope's Gallies paffed by without Itopping in this Yort. Thofe of Maltha are likewife gone home.
Venice, otab. 26, We tưve advice by feveral Veffels arrived from the Levant, that Captain-General Morofini Gailed the $2 d$ of the laft Month from Napoli di Romania with the Fleet of this State, taking hiscourfe towards the Archipelago, where he has already fat feveral of the Iflands under Contribution. We are informed by the fame way, that fome Venetian Men of War coming before Malvafia, the Garifon, which were 250 Men , upon the fift Summons furrendred the place, conditioning to be tranfperted to Patraffo. Some Gentleinen who
 account we had of the death of Signior Fa iftin della Riva, Proveditore-General of Napoli di Romania, and that Signior Gafpar Bragadin had fucceeded him in that Govemment ; and farther tell us, that they left General Coning marke ill of a Fever; and that the Prince of Brunfrucke was likewife not well, but that he was notwithflanding gone with the Auxiliary Forces of Lunenburg and Saxony to Fant, where they are to winter; The Ships that tranfported them thither, being commanded by Signior Pezani, have Orders to go and cruize in the Seas of Safeno, which are very much infefted with Pyrats, It is renorted that the Captain-General has taken a Ca ftie in the Ifle of Scio, in which were 200 Turks, and that he intends to polfers himfelf of fome other Fortreffes in thofe Seas, to cut off the communication between the Iflands of the Archipelago and the Kingdom of Candia. Several Officers are now here who offer toraife Regiments in Germany and Italy for the Service of this State againft the next Campagne, fome of which are treating with by order of the Senate.

Genoua, ©ftob. 21. The Pope's Gallies are arrived at Civits Vecchia ; and the Gally of this State that ferved with them this Summer is returned hither. The Mafter of a veffel arrived from Alexandria reports, that before his departure from thence the Garifons of Navarin and Madon arrived there, and had greatly increafed the conflernation that was among thofe People. That the Baffa of Alexandria tind received frefh Orders from the Port, to raife what Men he could, and to fend them to the Mores, but that all his endeavors to fatisty the Geand Yifier in this particular, wece very unfuc-
cefful, not having been able to raife irfa, very confis derable time above 500 Men, and that exeh of thefe few, feveral had deferted; and that the Garifons of Navarin and Modon had been fent to ferve in" Candia.

Lisbone, Ottob.7. The King of Portugal has declared to his Council of State, his refolition to demand in Marriage the Princefs of $N$ burg, anthed fend the Count de Viilar Mayor in the quality of his Ambaffador to the Elector Palatin ler Father, for that purpofe.

Lembergh; Octob. 18. This week arrived here an Exprefs from the Army, with the news of the ViCtory which the Poles obtained the $4^{\text {th }}$ Inftant againft the Turks and Tartars; of whom it's faid above 6000 were killed upon the place, and 300 tahen prifoners, among which were feveral of their Principat Officers. Prince fames was engaged in the hotteft of the action, and took one of their chief Commanders prifoner with bis own hand; of the Poles there were about 1500 killed in this occafion, and among thefe divers Perfons of quality ; but what was faid of the Prince of Courland's being of the number of the flaip monvec ominan inay arrny wasencamped the $\mathbf{2}$ th Inltant not far from a place called Pefcbana, between the Ntefter and the Pruth.

Vicnna, o\{tob. 27. The Duke of Lorrain is expected here in few days; The laft Letters from Buda told us he was gone from thence towards Gram. Of the Troops his Highnef brought with him to Peft, the Foot were put inte Buda to reinforce that Garifon, and the Horfe and Dragoons were fent under the command of General Veteranitojoyn the Imperial Forces before Segedin, upon the advice his Highnefs had received that the Serashier Achmet Baffa was marching with a Body of Turks and Tartars to relieve that place. The Letters from the Imperial Cany commanded by Prince Lous of Badon, of the 18th Inftant, give an account, that having with fome difficulty paffer the Drave, by reafon it was extreamly fwelled by the Rains, they arrived the 1 sth before Five Churcles; That the fame day they loolged themfelves in the Town, and when thefe Letters canue away, were sdvanced to the foot of the Ramparts of the Caftle, in which they had made two breaches, fo that we doubt not but our next advices will bring the news that this place is furrendred, or taken by Affault. They write from Craatia that Count 跑eph de Rabata, Governor of Carelfadt was marched with 2000 Men towards the Frontiers of Dalmatia, to hinder the defign of 6000 Turks, who, he was informed, were drawn together to make an incurfion into the Territories of the Republick of Venice.
