Buckingham Palace, May 8, 1856.

THIS day the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor, the Aldermen, Recorder, Sheriffs, Common Council, and Officers of the city of London, waited upon Her Majesty with the following Address, which was read by the Right Honourable J. A. Stuart Wortley, M.P., the Recorder, and which Her Majesty was graciously pleased to receive upon the Throne:

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's loyal and dutiful subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the "I gratefully acknowledge the many and concity of London, in Common Council assembled, spicuous proofs of the zeal and unanimity of my

approach your Majesty's Throne with our humble but earnest congratulations on the close of the war.

By the successful negociations and conclusion of a definitive Treaty, Peace is at once happily and honourably restored, while it is guaranteed for the future by the concurrence and cordial participation of all the Great Powers of Europe.

Compelled to enter into the war in defence of the violated territory of an ancient empire, long bound to this country by ties of amity and alliance, the Western Powers had no object of aggrandizement to seek; and your Majesty and your illustrious Allies, the Emperor of the French and the King of Sardinia, have given to the world a signal example of moderation and forbearance, hy accepting in the hour of triumph, and when best prepared to pursue that triumph to its results, the intervention of a friendly Sovereign, and sparing to a gallant enemy the further humiliation that awaited him.

We thankfully recognize the hand of God in the successes achieved by our arms in spite of difficulties and sufferings rarely equalled, and arising chiefly from want of recent experience of war on so vast a scale; and, while we deeply sympathize with your Majesty's grief for the loss of the brave officers and men who have gloriously fallen, we proudly rejoice to record that in no former war has the generous and enduring bravery of the British soldier and sailor, vieing with that of their valiant Allies, been more brilliantly conspicuous.

We now look forward with renewed hope and confidence to the further development, under Divine Providence and the continuance of your Majesty's mild and beneficent reign, of all the arts and resources of Peace; and we trust that in the future, as in the past, our beloved country will, under these blessed influences, be again and ever foremost in the ranks of civilization and social improvement.

To which Address Her Majesty was pleased to return the following most gracious Answer:

- "I thank you for your loyal and dutiful  ${f A}{f d}{f d}{f ress}$ .

people, and the generous and enduring bravery of my soldiers and sailors, during the war in which we have been engaged, and which, in conjunction with my illustrious Allies, I have been enabled to conduct to an honourable and satisfactory termination.

"I accept with sincere gratification your congratulations on the conclusion of a Treaty by which the objects of the war have been fully secured, and Peace has been re-established with the cordial concurrence of all the Great Powers of Europe.

"I trust that this Peace, resting as I have reason to believe on a firm and secure basis, may be long continued to us, and that its blessings may, under Divine Providence, be widely experienced in friendly intercourse among Nations, and in the rapid progress of civilization and social improvement."

They were all very graciously received, and had the honour of kissing Her Majesty's hand.

Whereas we have deemed it expedient that a Commission should issue for the purpose of en-

quiring into the system by which Gentlemen are permitted to enter Our Service, and Officers in Our Army are allowed to be advanced by the Purchase of Commissions at fixed prices, and likewise to retire from Our Service by the Sale of the same; and that the said Commission should report to Us whether it may be expedient to make any changes in the existing system.

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your zeal, discretion, and ability, have authorised and appointed, and do by these presents authorise and appoint you, the said Edward Adolphus Duke of Somerset, Edward Henry Stanley, Sidney Herbert, Edward Ellice, Edward Buckley Wynyard, Sir De Lacy Evans, Sir Harry David Jones, Sir Henry John William Bentinck, George Carr Glyn, and Edward Robert Wetherall, to be Our Commissioners for the purposes aforesaid; and We do hereby authorise and empower you Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, to obtain information thereupon by the examination of all persons most competent, by reason of their knowledge, habits, or experience, to afford it, and also by calling for all documents, papers, or records which may appear to you, or any three or more of you, calculated to assist your researches, and to promote the formation of a sound judgment upon the subject.

And we do hereby command and require you, or any three or more of you, to report to us, under your hands and seals, with all convenient speed, your opinion whether it may be expedient to make any, and, if any, what changes in the system by which,

Firstly. Gentlemen are permitted to Purchase first Commissions in Our Army,

Secondly. Officers are permitted to Purchase any higher Commissions,

Thirdly. Officers are permitted to retire from Our Army by the Sale of their Commissions, all at prices established by Regulations of Our Royal Predecessors, and likewise whether the sanction thus given to first entry into Our Army, and subsequent promotion by Purchase and retirement by Sale of Commissions, has been beneficial or otherwise to the interests and character of Our Army generally.

And we will and command, and by these presents ordain, that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you Our said Commissioners or any three or more of you may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not contained from time to time by adjournment.

And for your further assistance in the execution of these presents, we do hereby authorise and empower you to appoint a Secretary to this Our Commission, whose services and assistance We require you to use from time to time as occasion may require.

Given at Our Court, at St. James's, the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, in the nineteenth year of Our reign.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a copy of a Portuguese regulation issued by the Governor-General of the province of Angola, notifying that no customs' duties will be levied at the port of Ambriz on foreign commerce, until the expiration of one year from the date of the publication of a tariff of duties, and that the port will, therefore, continue free for such commerce until the expiration of that period.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Acting Consul at Puerto Rico, reporting that Customs Regulations to the following effect have been established in that Island.

First. That direct importation between that island and ports of produce, be protected by a reduction of 6 per cent. upon the duties payable according to the Tariff.

Second. That in future the fines of 2 per cent., imposed by the custom-houses upon invoices of merchandise badly classified, proceeding from

St. Thomas, be annulled.

That commodities which in quality and essential circumstances do not agree with the manifests that the interested parties have to present, within twenty-four hours after the vessel anchors in the port shall be denounced for confiscation. Thus while affording every facility to honest traffic, a corresponding punishment will be inflicted on those who deliberately attempt to defraud the interests of the Revenue.

Third. That henceforth the  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. extra charge upon vessels proceeding from one port, and touching in others not being the productive ones, in search of a market for their cargoes, be not enforced, but they will be obliged to prove in the Custom-house at the port of discharge, by means of Spanish consular certificates, that no business transaction has been effected in ports at which they may have touched.

Fourth. Vessels importing a full cargo into bond will be exempt from tonnage dues; but they will pay them in addition to the ordinary tariff duties, upon the whole or part of the cargo if

afterwards declared for consumption.

Fifth. That by way of compensation for the concessions granted to commerce, and with the object also of constructing and maintaining new warehouses that may be projected, a duty of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. will in future be exacted every six months, as a deposit duty upon articles bonded, instead of  $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. as at present paid; the first six months being supposed to have elapsed twenty-fours hours after the goods are stored, and the second, twenty-four hours after the completion of the first six months. It being well understood that the effects exported under bond to other ports are not to be charged any other duties, royal or municipal, beyond the one per cent. already mentioned.
