IT is this day ordered, by Her Majesty in Council, that the Parliament be prorogued from Tuesday the twenty-ninth day of July instant, to Tuesday the seventh day of October next.

HER Majesty in Council was this day pleased, upon a representation of the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council on Education, to appoint the Reverend Robert Edgar Hughes, M.A., Fellow and Tutor of Magdalen College, Cambridge, to be one of Her Majesty's Assistant Inspectors of Schools.

AT the Court at *Osborne House, Isle of Wight*, the 28th day of *July*, 1856,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament, holden in the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to prohibit the importation of sheep, cattle, or other animals, for the purpose of preventing the introduction of contagious or infectious disorders," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time, by Order in Council, to make such regulations for subjecting sheep, cattle, horses, or other animals to quarantine, or for causing the same to be destroyed upon their arrival in this country, or for destroying any hay, straw, fodder, or other article whereby it appears to Her Majesty that infection or contagion may be conveyed, and generally to make such regulations with respect to the importation of sheep, cattle, horses, or other animals as Her Majesty may consider to be necessary in order to prevent the introduction of any contagious or infectious disorder, and also by any further Order or Orders in Council, from time to time, to revoke the whole or any part of such Order or Orders issued, under the authority of the said Act.

And whereas by Order in Council, bearing date the fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, issued in pursuance of said Act, Her Majesty was pleased to make certain regulations with respect to the importation of sheep and lambs infected with a certain contagious disease, and whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Order, and to extend the provisions thereof.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and under the authority of the said Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order in Council, dated the fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, shall, from and after the day of the insertion hereof in the London Gazette, cease and determine.

And whereas it has been represented to Her Majesty that sheep, lambs, cattle, and pigs infected with certain contagious or infectious disorders are from time to time imported or brought into this county, whereby infection or contagion may be conveyed.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the said Act, doth order, and it is hereby further ordered, that if any sheep, lambs, cattle or pigs imported or brought into this country shall appear at the time of their importation to be infected with or labouring under any contagious or infectious disorder whereby infection or contagion may be conveyed such sheep, lambs, cattle or pigs and all or any sheep, lambs, cattle, or pigs imported or brought into this country in the same ship or vessel with any sheep, lambs, cattle, or pigs which shall appear to be so diseased, and all hay, straw, fodder or other article by which it shall appear that infection or contagion may be conveyed, shall be seized and detained by the officers of Her Majesty's customs at the port of import, and the circumstances be forthwith reported by such officers to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs, and if it be certified to the said Commissioners by any veterinary surgeon appointed by them to inspect such sheep, lambs, cattle or pigs, that they or any of them are infected with or labouring under any such disorder, then the said Commissioners may, if they think proper, cause such sheep, lambs, cattle or pigs as are so certified to be forthwith destroyed, and they the said Commissioners shall thereupon give such directions as they think fit, either for destroying or for further detaining all or any others of the sheep, lambs, cattle or pigs which may have been so imported or brought into this country in the same ship or vessel with the sheep, lambs, cattle, or pigs so certified as aforesaid, together with all such hay, straw, fodder or other article, or for restoring the same to the owner or owners thereof, subject to any conditions which they may think fit to prescribe, and upon payment by such owner or owners of any expenses incurred by the said Commissioners in respect of the detention thereof.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament, held in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to facilitate and arrange proceedings in the County Courts," it is enacted, that, if the council of any city or borough, or a majority of the ratepayers of any parish, within the limits of which a court of local jurisdiction other than a county court is established, under the Act of the ninth and tenth Vic., chap. ninety-five, or into the limits of which the jurisdiction of such court of local jurisdiction shall extend, shall petition the Queen in Council, that the jurisdiction of such court of local jurisdiction may be excluded in any causes whereof the county court hath cognizance, and if notice of such petition shall be given two months before it is presented, by public advertisement in such city, borough, or parish, and in some newspaper therein circulated, Her Majesty by Order in Council, may declare such exclusion of the jurisdiction of such court of local jurisdiction throughout the whole or any part of the district assigned or which may hereafter be assigned to such county court, if no peti-

tion against declaring such exclusion be presented, and no caveat be entered at the council office.

And whereas the council of the city of Worcester, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, praying that the jurisdiction of the court of record holden in the said city, called "The Court of Pleas of the city of Worcester," shall be excluded in all causes whereof the county court holden in the said city, hath cognizance, in which the debt or damages sought to be recovered shall not exceed twenty pounds, and all actions of ejectment between landlord and tenant wherein the annual rent of the premises, of which possession is sought to be recovered shall not exceed fifty pounds.

And whereas notice of such petition has been given as required by the said Act, and no petition against declaring such exclusion has been presented, and no caveat has been entered at the Council Office.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to declare and doth hereby declare that the jurisdiction of the said court of record in the city of Worcester, called "The Court of Pleas of the city of Worcester," be excluded in all causes whereof the county court holden in the said city hath cognizance, in which the debt or damage sought to be recovered shall not exceed twenty pounds, and in all actions of ejectment between landlord and tenant, wherein the annual rent of the premises of which possession is sought to be recovered shall not exceed fifty pounds.

Whereof the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Worcester, for the time being, and all other persons whom it may concern are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

And whereas it has seemed fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that all the provisions of the said Act should be extended and applied to the Court of Record, holden in the city of Worcester, called "The Court of Pleas of the city of Worcester;"

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that within one month after this Order shall have been made and published in the

London Gazette, all the provisions of the said "Summary Procedure on Bills of Exchange Act, 1855," shall extend and apply to the said Court of Record, called "The Court of Pleas of the city of Worcester," except in any causes whereof the County Court holden in the said city hath cognizance.

And Her Majesty is further pleased, by and with the advice aforesaid, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all the powers or duties exercisable by the Court or a Judge, under any of the sections of the said Act hereby applied to the Court of Pleas of the city of Worcester, shall, as regards matters and proceedings in the said Court be exercisable and exercised by the Judge of the said Court, and that all the powers or duties exercisable by the Masters of the said Courts, or any three of them, under the first section of the said Act, shall, as regards matters and proceedings in the said Court of Pleas, be exercisable and exercised by the Registrar of the said Court.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, within one month after this Order shall have been published in the

London Gazette, all the provisions of the said "Common Law Procedure Act, 1852," and of the said "Common Law Procedure Act, 1854," and the rules made and to be made in pursuance of the said Acts, shall extend and apply to the said Court of Record, called "The Court of Pleas of the city of Worcester," except in any causes whereof the County Court holden in the said city hath cognizance.

And Her Majesty is further pleased, by and with the advice aforesaid, to order and it is hereby ordered, that all the powers or duties exercisable by the Court or a Judge, under the said "Common Law Procedure Acts, 1852 and 1854," hereby applied to the Court of Pleas of the city of Worcester, shall, as regards matters and proceedings therein be exercisable and exercised by the Judge of the said Court, that all the powers or duties exercisable by a master under the said Acts shall as regards matters and proceedings in the said Court, be exercisable and exercised by the Registrar of the Court, and that the powers or duties exercisable by a Sheriff under the said Acts, shall, as regards matters and proceedings in the said Court, be exercisable and exercised within the jurisdiction of the said Court by the Serjeants-at-Mace, of the said city of Worcester.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England" it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time, to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit;

And whereas certain Orders in Council have been made, directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyards and burial-grounds hereinafter mentioned from the time mentioned in such orders respectively; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyards and burial-grounds be postponed;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards and burial-grounds be postponed as follows, viz.:

In the churchyard of the parish of BERKELEY, from the fifth of August, to the fifth of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six;

In the churchyard of NEW BRENTFORD, from the first of July instant, to the first of January; one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, on condition that (except in private vaults and graves) interments take place only in the unused portion of the ground;

In the parish churchyard and in the new churchyard of CHATTERIS, from the first of August, to the first of November, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six ;

In the churchyard of the parish of FLINT, from the first of July, to the first of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six :

In the cathedral precincts, GLOUCESTER, in the churchyards of St. Aldate, St. John the Baptist, St. Michael with St. Mary de Grace, St. Mary de Crypt, St. Nicholas, St. Mary de Lode, St. Catherine, and Christ Church (Spa), and in the burial-grounds of the Infirmary, of the Independent, Wesleyan, Baptist, and Unitarian Chapels, and of St. Michael, all in the said city, from the thirtieth of June, to the first of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six ;

In the burial-grounds of St. Mary's Chapel, the Baptist Chapel, the Presbyterian Chapel, the English Presbyterian Chapel, and of the Quakers' Meeting House, in the town of MARYPORT, and parish of Cross Canonby, from the first of August to the first of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six ;

In the churchyard of St. Philip SHEFFIELD, from the first of July instant, to the first of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, on condition that in the meantime one body only be buried in a grave, and that no grave be made less than five feet deep, and in soil free from remains.

In the churchyard of NEW WINDSOR, and in the burial-ground of the Baptist Chapel, and in the Acre Burial-ground, in Windsor, from the first of August next, to the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time, to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit ;

And whereas by an Order in Council of the thirteenth of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, burials were directed to be discontinued in the Quakers' burial-ground at BLACKBURN, from and after the first of May then next, and such time has since been postponed to the first of May last, and it seems fit that the said order be varied ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, in lieu thereof, that burials be discontinued in the said

burial-ground, except in-ground which has never been previously buried in, and which is more than ten feet from any building.

And whereas by an Order in Council of the thirty-first of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, burials were directed to be discontinued from and after the first of October in that year, in the Primitive Methodist burial-ground, near Daisy Hill, *Manningham*, BRADFORD, in the County of York, and it seems fit that the said order be varied ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, in lieu thereof, that burials be discontinued in the said burial-ground, except in vaults and graves which can be opened without the exposure of remains, and in which each coffin shall be imbedded in powdered charcoal and separately entombed in an air-tight manner.

And whereas by an Order in Council of the eighteenth of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, burials were directed to be discontinued in the burial-ground of the Independent Chapel, COGGESHALL, Essex, from and after the first of August then next, and such date has since been extended to the first of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and it seems fit that the said Order be varied ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the use of the following vaults in the said burial-ground may still be allowed, after the said first of September, provided that the said vaults, when required, be opened without disturbing soil that has been already buried in, and that each coffin be imbedded in a layer of powdered charcoal, four inches thick, and be separately entombed in an air-tight manner ; viz. : one vault belonging to F. U. Patterson, Esq., opened in one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five ; two vaults belonging to the Unwin family, opened in one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three and one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four ; and one vault belonging to Charles Moore, Esq., opened in one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four.

And whereas by an Order in Council of the eighteenth of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, burials were directed to be discontinued in part of the Wesleyan Chapel General Cemetery, *Cheetham Hill*, in the parish of MANCHESTER, and regulated in the rest of such Cemetery, and directed to be wholly discontinued therein (except in then existing private vaults and graves) from the first of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and it seems fit that the said Order be varied ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, in lieu thereof, that interment in the said cemetery be discontinued, except in family vaults and graves ; that no grave be less than five feet deep, and no coffin be placed within a foot of any other coffin, unless in a vault or brick grave, in which each coffin shall be imbedded in charcoal, and separately entombed in an air-tight manner.

And whereas by an Order in Council of the eleventh of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, burials were directed to be discontinued from the first of May then next, in the churchyard of MILTON, next Gravesend, and it seems fit that the said Order be varied ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that interments may take place in now existing vaults and brick graves, in the said churchyard, provided that such vaults and brick graves, when required, be opened without dis-

turbing soil that has been already buried in ; that each coffin be embedded in a layer of powdered charcoal, four inches thick, and be separately entombed in an air-tight manner ; and that the only bodies interred be those of the husbands, wives, parents, unmarried children, and brothers and sisters of those already buried therein.

And whereas by an Order in Council of the eighth of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, certain Regulations were made in respect of burials in the churchyard of St. Michael, PEMBROKE, and by another Order in Council of the twenty-fourth of June last, other regulations were made in lieu thereof, and it seems fit that the said last-mentioned Order be varied ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the words in the said Order of the twenty-fourth of June last, contained, viz. "unless to bury another member of the same family, in which case a layer of earth, a foot thick, is to be left between the coffins," be, and the same are hereby repealed, so far as they regard the said churchyard of St. Michael, Pembroke.

And whereas by an Order in Council of the eighteenth of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, burials were directed to be discontinued from and after the first of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, in the churchyard of St. Gregory, SUDBURY, in the county of Suffolk, and it seems fit that the said Order be varied ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, in lieu thereof, that the ancient part of the said churchyard remain closed, with the exception of now existing vaults and brick graves which can be opened without disturbing soil that has been already buried in, the use of which will be permitted until the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, on condition that each coffin to be interred, be embedded in a layer of powdered charcoal, four inches thick, and be separately entombed in an air-tight manner ; and that burials may be continued until the said first of January next, in the new portion of the said churchyard, provided that, with the exception of family vaults and graves, one body only be buried in a grave, and that with the same exception, no grave be re-opened.

And whereas by two Orders in Council of the twenty-ninth of March, and eighth of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, burials were directed to be discontinued from and after the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, in the churchyards of All Saints and St. Catherine, WIGAN, and in the burial-grounds attached to the Independent Chapel, Standishgate, to the Presbyterian Chapel, to St. Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Standishgate, to Lord-street Chapel, and to St. John's Roman Catholic Chapel, Standishgate, in the said borough, and such time has since been extended to the first of September next, and it seems fit that the said Orders be varied ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following words be added to the said two Orders in respect of the abovementioned churchyards and burial-grounds in Wigan, viz. : "except in vaults and brick graves for the burial of the husband, wife, parents, and children, of persons already interred therein, in which case each coffin shall be imbedded in charcoal, and separately entombed in an air-tight manner."

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intitled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in any of the under-mentioned parishes without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with the following modifications :

DARFIELD.—Forthwith in the *church of Worsbrough*, in the parish of Darfield, and also in the *churchyard*, except in now existing brick graves which can be opened without disturbing soil that has been already buried in, and in which each coffin shall be embedded in a layer of powdered charcoal four inches thick, and be separately entombed in brick or stone work properly cemented.

BRADFORD, YORKSHIRE.—Forthwith in the whole of the *churchyard* of the parish of Bradford, in the county of York, except in private vaults and graves which can be opened without the disturbance of remains, and in which each coffin shall be embedded in powdered charcoal and separately entombed in an airtight manner.

HARTLEPOOL.—Forthwith in the *parish churchyard* of Hartlepool, except in now existing vaults and brick graves, in which each coffin shall be embedded in powdered charcoal and separately entombed in an airtight manner, and except for the burial of widowers and widows of those already buried in such other graves as can be opened without the disturbance of remains.

LEOMINSTER, HEREFORDSHIRE.—Forthwith in the *parish church* of Leominster, and also in any aisle having internal communication therewith, and that in the *churchyard* every coffin buried in a vault or brick grave shall be embedded in powdered charcoal, and separately entombed in an airtight manner.

WHITKIRK.—Forthwith in the *parish church* of Whitkirk, in the county of York.

MARKET DRAYTON.—Forthwith in the *parish church* of Market Drayton, otherwise Drayton-in-Hales, and also (except in vaults and brick graves, in which each coffin shall be embedded in powdered charcoal and separately entombed in an airtight manner, and in graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the exposure of remains) in the *parish churchyard*, in *Little Drayton Churchyard*, and in the burial-grounds of the *Independent and Baptist Chapels*.

ORDINANCE above referred to.

We the Commissioners appointed for the purposes of an Act passed in the 17th and 18th years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "an Act to make further provision for the good government and extension of the University of Oxford, of the Colleges therein, and of the College of Saint Mary, Winchester," do in execution of the powers given to us by the said Act, make this ordinance for the conversion of four Fellowships within the King's Hall and College of Brasenose, in Oxford, commonly called Brasenose College, into Scholarships, within the same College.

The first, second, fourth, and sixth of the Fellowships within the said College which shall become vacant after this ordinance shall have been approved by Her Majesty in Council, shall not be filled up; and all the emoluments of and appertaining to the same four Fellowships which would have been payable to the persons elected into the same and their successors had the same been filled up, shall be applied, as such emoluments shall become available by the occurrence of successive vacancies, in maintaining within the said College as many Scholars receiving a yearly stipend, not less than sixty pounds each, as the amount for the time being available shall allow: Provided always that the number of Scholars to be maintained out of the emoluments of the said four Fellowships shall at no time be greater than twelve: Provided also that if any Fellowship or Fellowships within the said College shall be vacant at the time when this ordinance shall be approved as aforesaid, such one Fellowship (if but one), or one of such Fellowships (if more than one), shall for the purposes of this ordinance be considered as having become vacant immediately after such approval, and as one of the four Fellowships hereby directed to be converted,

And with respect to the scholars to be maintained as aforesaid out of the emoluments of the said four fellowships we ordain as follows:

Every Scholar shall be elected by the Principal, Vice-Principal, Dean, Lecturers, and Tutors of the said College, or, in case of the absence of any of them, by such of them as shall be present (being not fewer than three in number) after a competitive examination of the candidates in such subjects, and conducted in such manner as the Principal and Fellows shall from time to time determine.

The election of the Scholars shall take place on such day in each year as the Principal and Fellows shall appoint, subject to the provision respecting postponement hereinafter contained, and notice of such intended election shall be given by the Principal, or in his absence, by the Vice-Principal, in such manner as the person so giving notice shall deem best adapted to ensure publicity twenty days at least before the day of election.

No person who shall have attained the age of twenty years or shall be an Exhibitioner on the foundation of Mr. William Hulme shall be capable of being elected a Scholar, and no person shall be admitted to be a candidate who shall not produce testimonials of his moral character satisfactory to the Principal or in his absence to the Vice-Principal.

Whenever there shall be no candidate whom the electors shall judge duly qualified for election, it shall be lawful for them to postpone the election to some other day, to be fixed by them for the purpose, not later than the day which shall be appointed by the Principal and Fellows for the election of Scholars in the next year, and every such postponed election shall be held and conducted in the same manner in which the elections of Scholars are hereinbefore directed to be held and conducted.

The Scholarships shall be tenable for five years and no longer, but in the case of any Scholarship, the election to which shall have been postponed as aforesaid, the said term of five years shall be computed from the day on which the election would have taken place if there had been no postponement, and every Scholar who shall marry, or shall be elected to a Fellowship or to an Exhibition on the foundation of Mr. William Hulme, in the said College or to a Fellowship or Scholarship in any other College, shall *ipso facto* vacate his Scholarship.

Every Scholar shall be subject to such regulations as to residence, instruction, discipline, and attendance on divine worship as the Principal and Fellows shall from time to time determine, and may be deprived of his Scholarship by the Principal and Fellows for any misconduct which shall in their judgment deserve deprivation, but with liberty to appeal against such deprivation to the Visitor of the said College.
