## PROVINCE OF CANADA.

By His Excellency Sir EDMUND WALKER HEAD, Baronet, Governor-General of British North America, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over the Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and the Island of Prince Edward, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

To all to whom these presents shall come, or whom the same may concern—Greeting:

GEO. ET. CARTIER, *Attorney-General.*

WHEREAS with a view to promote the trade of the Province of Canada by direct communication with the ocean, it has been deemed expedient to offer every encouragement for means calculated to render the navigation of the St. Lawrence easy and secure; and whereas arrangements have, by and with the advice and consent of Her Majesty's Executive Council for the said province, been entered into with certain contractors for the use of powerful and safe steam vessels to be employed as tug-boats in the said river, to tow vessels in the same from any point between the island of Anticosti and the city of Quebec, on terms highly advantageous to ship owners; and whereas it is desirable that publicity should be given to the tariff for such towage. Now know ye, that I hereby proclaim and make known that, under and pursuant to the said arrangements, four powerful steam vessels are now under contract to ply in the said River St. Lawrence for the above purposes, viz.: two first class iron screw tug steamers, named "Queen Victoria" and "Emperor Napoleon," of seven hundred and fifty effective horse power each, built by Messrs. R. Napier and Sons, of Glasgow, and two Canadian built paddle steamers, named "Admiral" and "Advance," and that the tariff of rates for towing vessels within the above limits has been established at the sums mentioned in the schedule hereunto annexed.

Given under my hand and Seal at Arms, at Toronto, this fifteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Florence, announcing the publication of an Edict prohibiting the exportation of corn of all kinds from the Roman States until further orders.

*Whitehall, August 15, 1856.*

The Queen, taking into Her royal consideration that upon the decease of Edmund, Earl of Cork and Orrery, which happened in the month of June last, the honour and dignity of Earl of Cork and Orrery devolved upon Richard St. Lawrance, now Earl of Cork and Orrery, as eldest son and heir of Charles Boyle, Esq., commonly called Viscount Dungarvon, who died in the month of August, 1834, and who, when living, was the eldest son and heir apparent of the said Edmund, Earl of Cork and Orrery; and that, according to the ordinary rules of honour, the brothers and sisters of the said Richard St. Lawrance, now Earl of Cork and Orrery, cannot enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to them had their late father, the said Charles Boyle, survived his said father, Edmund, Earl of Cork and Orrery, and had succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Cork and Orrery; Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that William George Boyle, Esq., Edmund John Boyle, Esq., Louisa Caroline Elizabeth Boyle and Mary Emily Boyle, Spinsters, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence, as if their late father, the said Charles Boyle, had survived his father, the said Edmund, Earl of Cork and Orrery, and had succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Cork and Orrery.

And also to command that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
