"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for authorizing the sale of certain property formerly belonging to the chancellorship of the cathedral church of Salisbury, and now vested in us.

"Whereas it is by the said Act (amongst other things) enacted, that notwithstanding the charge by that Act created (being a charge created in favour of the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne), all the same and the like powers and rights of ownership as are possessed and enjoyed respecting and over any lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or other hereditaments whatsoever, by any absolute owner thereof, shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over all or any lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or other hereditaments vested in us under certain Acts therein mentioned (being the Acts under which the property herein-after described is vested in us), and may, subject to the provisions of the same Acts, and of the now reciting Act, be exercised by us, by proper instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, with a certain proviso respecting the application of every sum of money received as the consideration or purchase money for the sale, transfer, or conveyance by us of any of such lands, tithes, tenements, or other hereditaments, or of any estate or interest therein, and with a further proviso that none of such lands, tithes, tenements, or other hereditaments be sold, transferred, or conveyed, except by the authority of a scheme, and an

Order issued by your Majesty in Council ratifying the same:

"And whereas all the lands, tenements, hereditaments, and endowments formerly belonging to the said chancellorship (except any right of ecclesiastical patronage) became vested in us on the vacancy of the said office of Chancellor, which occurred on or about the fifth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, by the decease of the Right Reverend Hugh, Bishop of Carlisle, the then Chancellor, subject to any legally subsisting lease or leases thereof:

"And whereas application has been made to us for the purchase of all our estate and interest in certain portions of the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments; and, after due consideration, it appears to us to be expedient that we should be empowered to dispose of our interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us to be advisable:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that we may be authorized and empowered, by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands, tenements, hereditaments, or endowments heretofore belonging to the said chancellorship, and so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title, and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, or otherwise, as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable:

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette,

pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Salisbury.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 26.) UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

The Lighthouse Board of the United States has issued the following notices:—

##### *St. Croix Lighthouse, Maine.*

A wooden Lighthouse (white) will be built during the present season on Big Island, in the St. Croix River, otherwise called *Neutral Island* and *St. Croix Island*; and the tower will be on the top of the keeper's house.

The light shown will be fixed, of the natural colour, and the illuminating apparatus will be a Fresnel lens of the fifth order.

The centre of the light will be about forty feet above the level of high water, and visible about eleven nautical miles.

Notice of its latitude and longitude will be published before the light is in operation.

The light will appear for the first time on the night of Monday, the 2nd day of February, 1857, and will be kept burning during every night thereafter.

##### *Light at the Narrows, Boston Harbour.*

A screw pile lighthouse has been erected on the Spit abreast the Narrows, Boston Harbour.

The house is a hexagonal building, painted a dark brown colour; is elevated on seven iron piles, and surmounted with an iron lantern.

The light is designed as a guide to clear the Spit by vessels passing through the main ship channel.

On the night of the 1st of August (this month), and after, it was illuminated with a lens light of the sixth order, elevated 35 feet above high-water mark.

##### *Gay Head Light, Martha's Vineyard Sound.*

A new Lighthouse has been erected on Gay Head, entrance of Martha's Vineyard Sound. The tower is built of brick, and is thirty-five feet high. The keeper's houses are of brick also, and the centre of the tower is twelve feet in front of

the centre of the houses. The colour is the natural colour of the brick.

The focal plane of the light is one hundred and ninety-one feet above the level of the sea; and the distance at which it will be visible from the deck of a vessel, fifteen feet above the level of the sea, is at least twenty nautical miles.

The illuminating apparatus is a *revolving* Fresnel lens of the first order, showing a *bright flash every ten seconds*.

This light will be exhibited for the first time at sundown, December 1, 1856; from which date the revolving light shown at Gay Head at present will be discontinued.

#### *Calibogue Sound Light-vessel.*

A Light-vessel has been moored in Calibogue Sound (in  $4\frac{1}{4}$  fathoms water at low tide), between Grenadier Shoals and the Eastern Breakers, off the south-eastern point of Hilton Head. She is schooner-rigged, with a third mast for the lantern, hull painted red, and will show one bright white light at an elevation of 30 feet above the sea.

Tybe Light bears S.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W.

Tybe Beacon bears S.

Braddock's Point bears N. by E.

South-east point of Hilton Head bears E.N.E.

The light was shown for the first time on the evening of 1st August.

*Rathlin Island Lighthouse.*

THE Port of Dublin Corporation hereby give notice, that a Lighthouse has been erected on Rathlin Island, co. Antrim, from which Lights will be exhibited on the night of the 1st of November next, 1856, and thereafter will be lighted during every night from sunset to sunrise.

*Specification given of the position and appearance of the Lights, by Mr. Halpin, Superintendent of Lighthouses.*

The Lighthouse Tower is built on the north-east point of Rathlin Island, situate in Lat.  $55^{\circ} 18' 10''$  N., and Long.  $6^{\circ} 10' 45''$  W., bearing

From Rhins of Islay Light, S., distant 28 nautic miles.

From Mull of Cantire Light, W.N.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N., distant 13 nautic miles.

From Corsewall Point Light, N.W. b N., distant 40 nautic miles.

From Maiden Rock South Light, N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., distant 28 nautic miles.

As an additional means of marking this position, a *lower* light will be shown, of which the lantern is placed at base of the tower, on its eastern side.

The upper light, in lantern of the tower, will be *intermittent*, giving a *fixed bright light* during 50 seconds and *eclipsed* during 10 seconds—the periods of light and darkness following in regular succession. It will be visible from seaward between the bearings of S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. around by the

eastward, to N.E. b N., also in passing through the channel westward of Rathlin Island from N.E. b E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. to E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N., and will be coloured *red* on the line of the Carickavannan Rock. The focal plane is 243 feet over the level of the sea at high water, and in clear weather the light may be seen within the distance of 21 miles.

The *lower* light will be *fixed*, of the *natural appearance*; and being placed 61 feet below the level of the *upper*, will be seen as a separate light within the distance of 10 miles, and from seaward between the bearings of S.E. b S. and N.N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.

The tower is circular, 88 feet in height from its base to the ball over dome. A red belt will be painted under the projecting gallery.

Bearings stated are magnetic—Var.  $28^{\circ}$  W.
