TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of Postage," power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's 'Treasury from time to time by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British or Inland postage, payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant, and from time to time by Warrant as aforesaid, to alter or repeal any such altered rates, and to make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof.

And whereas it is expedient that regulations should be made for the transmission by the post of the letters hereinafter mentioned.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the power or authority in us for such purpose vested in and by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant (under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided) order and direct that on every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom and the Mauritius (direct or through any other colony, or through any foreign country), there shall be charged and taken in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such letters, an uniform British rate of sixpence.

And we direct that on every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, transmitted by the post between the Mauritius and any other of Her Majesty's colonies, or any foreign country, through the United Kingdom (whether through any colony or foreign country or not), there shall be charged and taken in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such letters, the rates of British postage following; that is to say:

For the conveyance of every such letter between the Mauritius and any part of the United Kingdom, a rate of sixpence, and for the conveyance of every such letter between the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet or ship conveying the same, and the colony or foreign country to or from which the same shall be forwarded, such a further or additional rate of postage as shall from time to time be charged and payable for British postage on letters posted or delivered at the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet or ship conveying the same and transmitted direct between such port and any such colony or foreign country.

And we direct that on every letter transmitted as is mentioned in this Warrant, exceeding half an ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken,

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and paid, progressive and additional rates of postage as follows, that is to say :

- On every such letter exceeding half an ounce in weight and not exceeding one ounce in weight two rates of postage.
- On every such letter exceeding one ounce, and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of postage.
- On every such letter exceeding two ounces, and not exceeding three ounces in weight, six rates of postage.
- And on every such letter exceeding three ounces, and not exceeding four ounces in weight, eight rates of postage.
- And for every ounce in weight above the weight of four ounces, there shall be charged and taken two additional rates of postage, and every fraction of an ounce above the weight of four ounces, shall be charged as one additional ounce, and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause, shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant, if not exceeding half an ounce in weight.

And we direct that in all cases in which any letter in respect of which any rate of postage is chargeable by this Warrant shall pass through a foreign country, any foreign postage payable thereon, shall be charged and paid thereon in addition to the British postage.

And we further direct, that nothing in this Warrant contained shall in anywise prejudice or affect the privilege granted by the said recited Act in favour of petitions and addresses forwarded to Her Majesty by the post, nor the privilege granted by the same Act to members of each House of Parliament to receive by the post petitions and addresses to Her Majesty, and petitions addressed to either House of Parliament, not exceeding thirty-two ounces in weight, exempt from postage, nor shall anything in this Warrant contained, in anywise prejudice or affect the privilege which seamen and soldiers employed in Her Majesty's service, and seamen and soldiers employed in the service of the East India Company, now by law enjoy of sending and receiving by the post, letters not exceeding half an ounce in weight subject to the regulations and restrictions in respect of the same.

And we further direct, that nothing in this Warrant contained shall be deemed or construed to extend to any letters or packets posted in or addressed to France or any foreign country through France, and transmitted between France or foreign countries through France and the Mauritius, all which last mentioned letters and packets shall be charged and chargeable with the same rates of postage as if this Warrant had not been signed.

And we further direct, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed or construed to extend to any letters, the sea conveyance of which shall be by a packet-boat belonging to, or employed by, or under the Government or Post Office of the United States of America, or the sea conveyance of which, in the Mediterranean, shall be by a French packet-boat, all which letters shall be charged and chargeable, as if this Warrant had not been signed.

And we further direct, that the term "by the post," used in this Warrant, shall, as to the sea conveyance, include the conveyance by any British or colonial, or foreign packet-boat (packet-boats belonging to, or employed by, or under the Government or Post Office of the United States of America, and French Mediterranean packet-boats

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excepted), and the said term shall also include the sea conveyance by any private ship.

Provided lastly, and we hereby declare and direct that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury, by Warrant duly made at anytime hereafter, to alter or repeal any of the rates hereby altered, or the regulations hereby made, and to make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu thereof, and from time to time to appoint, at what time the rates that may be payable, are to be paid.

W HEREAS the population of the township of Hunslet, in the borough of Leeds, in the county of York, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas, at a meeting of the Vestry of the said township, held in the Vestry of Saint Mary's Church, and by adjournment in the Church School Room, within the said township, after public notice in that behalf, on the fourteenth day of August instant, it was resolved,—

"That the Poor Law Board be requested to "issue an Order, under their seal of office, "directing that the Act passed on the 5th of "August, 1850 (13 and 14 Victoria, c. 57), "entitled 'An Act to prevent the holding "of vestry or other meetings in churches, "and for regulating the appointment of vestry "clerks,' shall be applied to and put in force "within this township, as regards that portion "of it only which relates to the appointment "of a Vestry Clerk, and that the amount of "salary which it is proposed should be as-"signed to him is £100 per annum, to be "payable quarterly, and that it is intended "that he should be required to give security "to the amount of £50.."

It was also resolved, --

- "That the Poor Law Board be requested to "assign to such Vestry Clerk the salary men-"tioned in the former Resolution, and the "duties following; namely:-
- "To give notice of and attend the Meetings of "Vestry and Committees appointed thereat.
- "To summon and attend meetings of the Over-"seers when required, and to enter the "minutes thereof."
- "To keep the accounts of all Charity Monies "which the Churchwardens and Överseers "are authorized or are accustomed to dis-"tribute.
- "To keep the Vestry Books, and the Parish "Deeds or Documents, and the Rate Books," and Accounts which are closed, and to give "copies of and extracts from the same to any

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"person entitled thereto, such person paying "for the same at the rate of Fourpence for "every seventy-two words or figures, and to "permit any person or persons rated to the "relief of the Poor of the said Township, at " all reasonable times, to inspect the same or " any of them.

- "To make out when required by the Vestry, "the Church Rate, and procure the same to "be signed and completed, and to retain the "custody thereof, and where there is no Col-"lector of Poor Rates or Assistant Overseer "to make out the Poor Rate, and procure "the same to be allowed, and to make all the "subsequent entries in the Rate Books, and "to give the notices thereof required by law.
- "To prepare and issue the necessary process for "recovering of arrears of rates respectively "before the Justices, and procure the sum-"monses to be served, and attend the Justices "thercon, and advise the Overseers as to the "recovery of such arrears.
- "To assist the Overseers in keeping and making "out and recovering their accounts whenever "required by them, and, subject to the Rules "and Regulations of the Commissioners for "administering the law for the relief of the "Poor, to examine from time to time the "accounts of the Assistant Overseer or Col-"lectors of Poor Rates, and their returns of "arrears.
- "To attend the audit of the Overseers' accounts, "and conduct all correspondence arising "therefrom, and to present such accounts to "the Vestry or other legal authority to be "passed.
- "To assist the Overseers in preparing and "making out all other Parochial Assessments "and Accounts, and in examining the ac-"counts of the Collectors of such assess-"ments.
- "To ascertain and make out the list of persons "liable to serve on Juries, and to cause the "same to be printed and duly published, and "returned to the Justices.
- "To give the notices for claims to vote for "Members of Parliament, and to make out "Lists of Voters, and get the same printed "and published and duly returned according "to law, and to attend the Court for revising "them, and to prepare, make out, and pub-"lish the Burgess lists and the list of Con-"stables.
- "To make out all returns required of the "Overseers by law or proper authority, and "to assist and advise the said Overseers in "all the duties of their office.
- "To assist the Overseers in relieving the Poor, "and keeping the accounts connected there-"with.
- "To enquire into the Settlements of Paupers "applying for relief or becoming chargeable, "and report thereon to the Board, and on in-"structions from the Board to obtain the "necessary orders of removal, and afterwards "to superintend the removal of Paupers "named therein, and to make out all accounts "connected therewith, and to recover all "sums of money payable thereunder; and, "where required, to give his best assistance "in supporting appeals, and taking journies "for and searching out evidence."

And whereas the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said township have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolutions.

Now, therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct :--

ART. 1.—That so much of the said Act, passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within, the said township of Hunslet.

ART. 2.—That a salary of one hundred pounds per annum shall be paid to the Vestry Clerk for the time being, appointed under the authority of the Statutes in such behalf and this Order, by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said township.

ART. 3.—That the salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual feast days in the year, namely, Michaelmas-day, Christmas-day, Lady-day, and Midsummer-day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators, in case he shall die while holding such office.

ART. 4.—That every person appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk in the said township shall give to the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said township a bond, in the penal sum of five hundred pounds, in the names of himself and two sufficient sureties, conditioned for the due and faithful performance of the duties of the office ; and every such officer shall give immediate notice to the said Churchwardens and Overseers of the death, insolvency, or bankruptcy of either of such suretics, and shall, when required by the said Churchwardens and Overseers, produce a certificate, signed by two householders, that his sureties are alive and believed by them to be solvent, and shall supply a fresh surety in the place of any such surety who may die, or become bankrupt or insolvent; provided that the Churchwardens and Overseers may, if they think fit, take the security of any society or company expressly authorized by statute to guarantee or secure the faithful discharge of the duties of any Poor Law Officer.

And we do hereby prescribe and direct that the said Vestry Clerk shall perform the following duties, in addition to those set forth in the said Act; that is to say: --

To assist the Overscers in relieving the Poor, and keeping the accounts connected therewith.

To enquire into the settlements of Paupers applying for relief or becoming chargeable, and to report thereon to the Overseers, and on receiving instructions from the Overseers to obtain the necessary orders of removal, and afterwards to superintend the removal of Paupers named therein, and to make out all accounts connected therewith, and to recover all sums of money payable thereunder; and, where required, to give his best assistance in supporting appeals, and in taking journies for and searching out evidence relating thereto.

And we do hereby order and direct, that a copy ot this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
