THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Parana, enclosing copy of a Law recently passed by the Argentine Legislature levying duties, as follows, upon merchandize brought into any of the provinces of the Argentine Confederation from within the Capes at the mouth of the River Plate, and which law will come into effect in the month of February, 1857.

ARTICLE I.

1st. Merchandize not subject to specific duty

shall pay double the ordinary duty.
2nd. Merchandize subject to specific duty shall, on its introduction, be subject to an additional duty of 30 per cent., ad valorem.

ARTICLE II.

Merchandize which may be introduced directly from outside the Capes by the said ports shall continue to pay only the ordinary duty.

ARTICLE III.

The natural and manufactured products of the Oriental Republic of the Uruguay, of the Republic of Paraguay, and of the Brazilian possessions situated within the Capes, introduced directly by the said ports come within the preceding article.

ARTICLE IV.

The natural and manufactured products of the Province of Buenos Ayres shall be admitted free of duty as national products.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Hamburgh, enclosing copy of a Proclamation of the Senator of the Ham-

burgh Marschlands, prohibiting, under a penalty of 50 dollars for each case, the importation of cattle from the Duchies of Holstein and Lauenburg, unless accompanied by a certificate from the authorities of the place from whence such cattle are imported, stating the district to be free from the pulmonary epidemic prevailing in those districts. Their Lordships have also received information that a similar prohibition has been enforced in the territory of Lubeck, as regards the cattle imported from the Duchies of Mecklenburgh Schwerin, Mecklenburgh Strelitz, and Holstein, unless accompanied by a like certificate.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Athens, enclosing a copy of a Circular addressed by the Greek Minister for Foreign Affairs to the Agents abroad of the Government, desiring them to bring to the notice of foreign capitalists the intention of the Government to concede to foreign companies various public works about to be undertaken.

The following are the works to which this circular has especial reference:

- 1. Drainage of lakes.
- 2. Construction of roads.
- 3. Construction of ports.

The conditions being as follows:

The works to be executed at the expense and on account of the Companies, according to plans previously drawn out and approved by the Government.

The Company will be required to deposit in the National Bank, if required by the Government, a sum in proportion to the importance of the work to be undertaken, as a guarantee for the fulfilment of the engagements, both as regards the time fixed for the execution of the works, as also the other conditions attached to the concession.

In satisfaction of these obligations the Greek Government will make the following conces-

A.—Drainage of Lakes.

To every Company undertaking works of this nature the Government will grant-

(a.) The revenue derived during a fixed time

and free from any impost, or else a certain settled

quantity of the land obtained.

(b.) Freedom from customs duties on all tools, machinery, &c., required for the prosecution of the works, as also upon the implements and seeds required for the culture of the land. Should the Company desire, for the purpose of cultivating such land, to introduce settlers, such settlers will enjoy, in addition to the privileges above mentioned, the following immunities, subject however to the ordinance of the $\frac{4}{16}$ April, 1834.

Freedom from all customs' duties on :-

Wearing apparel required by them and already used.

2. Necessary domestic furniture.

- 3. Carts, animals, &c., required for their service.
- 4. Necessary implements and all other advantages referred to in the above-mentioned ordinance.
- (c.) The Government will further grant to such settlers, land for the erection of houses, warehouses, churches, schools, &c., and for gardens, as also the land required for roads, public places, &c., agreeably to the plans drawn up. In case the land should not be granted to the Company for a fixed time on the terms of an entire franchise, the settlers will not be subject to any personal tax or land tax.

B.—Construction of Roads.

The following advantages will be granted to the undertakers of these works:

(a.) The land necessary for their construction and free right to obtain the necessary materials.

- (b.) The right to levy fixed tolls.(c.) All necessary implements imported for making and maintaining the roads to be free from customs duty.
- (d.) In respect to certain roads a minimum interest of 5 per cent. will be granted upon an amount of capital to be determined upon.

C .- Construction of Ports.

The Government will make the following concessions to undertakers of works of this nature:

- (a.) Port duties and other charges established by the laws in force, and levied on account of the Exchequer.
- (b.) Complete freedom from all import duties on machinery and implements required for the works.
- (c.) And lastly, a minimum guarantee of 5 per cent. for a certain period upon a capital to be determined upon.
