W. afterwards to the N.E. and back again to the N. W. The Weather , continued thus Tempeltuous all Night, accompanied with Thunder and Lightning; The, Chimndifs and R Roofs of a great manyHoufes were blown döw, and much mose mifctief was done, but it was not comparable to that which followed;for theDykes not being able to refift the Violence of the Sea, agitated by thefe terrible Storms, the, whole Country between this-place and Delfziel, being about 18 Eitgigh Miles, was the next morning overwhelmed - with Water, which in many places, was eight Foot higher than the very Dykes, and many People, and Thoufands of Cattle were drowned, the Water brealing even through the Walls of the Town of Delfziel, fo that height, that the Inhabitants were forced to betake themfelves to their Garrets and Upper Rooms for thelter; The whole Village of Oturdum is in a manner fwept away; At Termunderzx/ there is not one Houre left, above 300 People being drowned there, and only 19 efcaping; Herraskes, Weymert, Woldendorp; and all the Villages near the Eems, have fuffered extremely; The Weftera quarter has likewife had its thare in this Calamity, and the higheft Lands have not efcaped; OnSunday and yefterday it reached this City, the Lower Parts whereof are now all under Water; From the Walls of thiscity we can fee nothing but the Tops of Houfes and Steeples that remain above Water; In a word, the Mifery and Defolation is grester than can be expreffed.

Groning yn, Nav. 26. It's impoffible to defcribe the prelent fad condition of this Prowince, occa) $\Rightarrow$ oned by a moft terribie Inurdation that happened the 23 Inftant. The like has not been known thefe hundred years; The whole Province, except the figher parts of this City, lies under Watef; Whole Villages have been fwept away, and a great many People, with abumdance of Cattle drowned; And thofe that bave efcaped, heltring themfelwes in Garrets and upper Rooms, are in great diftrefs for wantof Relief; Nothirg but Lamentatiops, , hid the Jangling of Bells fonHelp, is heard through the wholecountry; And thoughall poffible, care is taken to affirt them from hence and other places, yet there not being Boats enough to afford help to all, it's to be feared many wilt be loft for want of it. At Oterdam near Delfizit, but 25 Perfons have eff caped; In the Village of Peterborze there are but three Houfes left, ftanding, and in general, all the Houfes quat Itood neas the Dyk have been fwept

The Marguis de Bedmar, Cantain General of the Artillery in thefe Countries arrived here this week from Spazn. The Lettecs from $V_{t}=$ enna of the 17 th Inftant, bring the confirmation of the Turks having abandoned the Fortrefs of Darda, of whith they give this account, That the Enemy hearing the Chriftians had taken Five Churches and Sjrclos, were feized with yuch fear, that they immediately quitted that Poft, after having drawn out the Cannon and Ammunition and that in their Retreat they burnt fand mined part of the Bridge of $E / f e c k e$ That the Imperial Tropps commanded by the Prince of Baden arriving there, had ruined the rett of the Bridge as far as they could go, being above 3000 Paces; After which they returned with a great many Prifoners towards Capofitar, intending to attack that place before they went into their Winter-quarters. Thefe Letters add, that an Envoy was arrived at Vienna from Prince Abafti, with a Train of zo Pesions, but not having had his Audience, his Buffels was not yet known; And that the Emperon was fending an Ambalfador to the King of Poland.
