Venice, Nov. 16. This week arrived here two Vessels from the Legapy, but we have by them no other News of our Fiset, than that, the Captain-General had been met about the 8th of the last mouth off of Seas. One of these Vessels has brought hither Deputies from St. Maura, who came to take an Oath of Fidelity to this State, in the Name, of all the Inhabitants of that Island, and to sollicit the configuration of the Priviledges granted them by the Captain-General. There are Letters from Danatia which say, that the Proveditor-General Cornare understanding that the Sanditor-General Cornaro understanding that the Sangiac of Erzegovina was drawing what Troops he could together, to make an Incussion into the Ve-netian Territories, did likewise assemble a Body of Men near Spalatra, to observe him. The Bassa's of Napoli di Romania and Clie ifa, ended their Quarantaine yelterday. Five hundred new raised Men arrived this week at the Lido; from whence they will, with the first opportunity, be transported to the Morea. Signior Lgrenzo Morosini, Brother to the Captain-General, is dead. They write from home, That the Pope hath sent the King of Poland a new Supply of Money to be employed in the War against the Turks.
