Leighorn, Nov. 5. The Gallies of our great Duke which lately returned from the Levant, where they served this Summer against the Turks, are disarmed: And most of the Officers are gone to Florence: But the Admiral Guady is still here. We have yet no News of the Bark that was separated from them by a

Storm, which encreases our fear that she is fallen into the hands of the Pyrats.

Venice, Nov. 16. This week arrived here two Vessels from the Levant, but we have by them no other News of our Fleet, than that the Captain-General had been met about the 8th of the last month off of Sep. One of these Vessels has brought hither Deputies from Sr. Maura, who came to take an Oath of Fidelity to this State, in the Name of all the Inhabitants of that Island, and to solicit the confirmation of the Priviledges granted them by the Captain-General. There are Letters from Dalmatia which say, that the Provéditeur-General Cornaro understanding that the Sanguac of Erzegovina was drawing what Troops he could together, to make an Inquisition into the Venetian Territories, did likewise assemble a Body of Men near Spalatro, to observe him. The Bassa of Napoli di Romania and Cliesfa, ended their Quarantine yesterday. Five hundred new raised Men arrived this week at the Lido; from whence they will, with the first opportunity, be transported to the Morca. Signior Lorenzo Morosini, Brother to the Captain-General, is dead. They write from Vienna, That the Pope hath sent the King of Poland a new Supply of Money to be employed in the War against the Turks.

Genova, Nov. 21. The Duke of Mantua arrived here the 10th Instant Incognito, intending to pass a month or six weeks in this place. We have advize that the Algerines have lately taken a Dutch Ship on these Coasts.

Marseilles, Nov. 8. By a Bark arrived in this Port we have Letters from Smirna of the 21st of September, giving an account that the Plague is very hot at Constantinople. And that the Captain Bassa, with 24 Gallies, and 9 Men of War, had had off of Metiline, a very sharp Fight with the Venetian Fleet, which lasted a whole day; That the Turks lost several of their Gallies, and one Man of War, and that the Captain Bassa was killed; of which we hope our next Advices from the Levant will bring a Confirmation, together with the farther Particulars.

Warsaw, Nov. 2. We have an account by Letters from Saxony of the 26th of the last month; That the King left the Army the 26th, which was then encamped near Nieswitz, under the Command of the Crown-General; That his Majesty arrived the same day at Halitz, and the following at Stry, where the Queen met him. That the Tartars were returned home. And that the Turks had put 500 Wagons laden with Provisions into Camminiec: The King upon the first notice he had of their march, sent a Detachment of Horse to attack this Convoy, but they came too late. We are told that the Dyet of this Kingdom will meet about the middle of January, but the place is not yet appointed.

Vienna, Nov. 17. They write from Upper Hungary, That after the taking of Ghonad on the River Nagros, the Imperial Forces, commanded by Gene.
