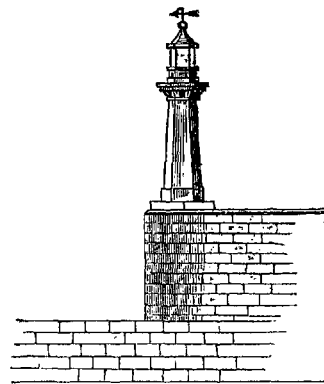
NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 45.) JERSEY.—CHANNEL ISLANDS.

Fixed Light at Verclut, St. Catherine's.

THE Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby give notice, that on and after the 1st day of January, 1857, a light will be exhibited from the light tower recently erected at the outer extremity of Verclut pier or breakwater, on the north side of St. Catherine's Bay, on the east coast of Jersey, one of the Channel Islands.

The light will be a fixed white light, the illuminating apparatus a lens of the sixth order. The light is placed at a height of 60 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be visible in ordinary weather from the deck of a ship at a distance of from 7 to 10 miles.



Verclut Lighthouse, from the east, at high water.

The light tower is an octagonal structure of iron, painted white. It is 30 feet high from base to vane, and stands on the outer extremity of the parapet wall of the pier, in lat. 49° 13' 18" N., long. 2° 1' 12" west from Greenwich, nearly.

The tide at Jersey ranges 20 feet at neaps, and 36 feet at ordinary springs.
