Now, therefore, in pursuance of the power and authority of the said Act of the 14th and 15th of Victoria, cap. 38, given to me as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and in conformity with the said application, I do, by this Provisional Order, under my hand, declare, subject to the confirmation hereof by Parliament, - that from the twenty-fifth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, the rate of interest shall be reduced from three pounds to two pounds per centum, per annum, upon the bonded or mortgage debt of fourteen thousand one hundred and eighty pounds, charged or sccured upon the tolls or revenues of the said road, and that the whole of the arrears of interest due and remaining unpaid upon the said debt at that date shall be extinguished.
