Nene Valley Drainage and Navigation Improvement Bill.

NOTICE is hereby given, that it is intended to apply to Parliament in the present session for leave to introduce into a Bill now pending in the Honourable the House of Commons, intituled "A Bill for granting further powers to the Nene Valley Drainage and Navigation Improvement Commissioners for the completion of the works in the Third District of Drainage, and for authorizing them to raise further money, and for other purposes," provisions for effecting all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):

To enable the Incorporated Commissioners acting in execution of "The Nene Valley Drainage and Navigation Improvement Act, 1852," and "The Nene Valley Drainage and Navigation Improvement (Amendment) Act, 1854," to purchase additional lands for the purposes of the undertaking on the south side of the River Nene, in the parish of Wisbech Saint Peter, in the Isle of Ely, and county of Cambridge, from a point on the south side, commencing at or near the Toll-house, in the parish of Wisbech Saint Peter, and terminating at or near a point opposite the public-house on the north bank, called the Three Horse Shoes, in the parish of Wisbech Saint Peter aforesaid; to authorize the incorporated Commissioners upon such lands so purchased, to divert the road on the south side of the river between the respective points before mentioned, and to form a new road within the limits of lateral deviation defined on the plan hereinafter mentioned, in lieu of the existing road on the south bank of the river, commencing and terminating at or near the points before described, and to appropriate the site of such existing road and other lands adjoining thereto, to the purposes of the improvements in the bed and channel of the river, and the erection of a new bank instead of the existing bank between the points aforesaid, or any part thereof.

To enable the incorporated Commissioners to carry into effect upon the lands, and within the limits before mentioned, all such works as may be necessary for deepening and widening the river, and removing and reconstructing the bank thereof within the limits aforesaid.

To purchase by compulsion or agreement the lands and houses necessary for the above purposes.

To constitute such works part of the improvements to be effected in the River by virtue of the Acts before-mentioned, and to defray the expense thereof out of the funds authorized or to be authorized to be raised and applied for the purposes of such works.

A plan and section, showing the proposed works and improvements on the said part of the river in respect of which the said lands are intended to be taken, and describing such lands, together with a book of reference to such plans, containing the names of the owners or reputed owners, lessees or

reputed lessees, and occupiers of the lands and houses, respectively, together with a copy of this notice, have been deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the Isle of Ely, at his office in Wisbech; and with the clerk of the Peace for the county of Cambridge, at his office at Cambridge; and with the parish clerk of the said parish of Wisbech Saint Peter, at his residence.
