This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to amend the Act of the sixth and seventh years of King William the Fourth, chapter one hundred and sixteen, for consolidating and amending the laws relating to the presentment of public money by grand juries in Ireland.

An Act to discontinue the taking of toll on the turnpike roads now existing in Ireland, and to provide for the maintenance of such roads as public roads, and for the discharge of the debts due thereon, and for other purposes relating thereto.

An Act to amend the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-two, so far as relates to the distribution of the constabulary force in Ireland.

An Act for making a railway from the Deeside Railway, at Banchory, to Charsleston of Aboyne.

An Act to incorporate a Company for extending the Banff, Macduff, and Turriff Junction Railway from Turriff to Banff and Macduff.
