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Lübnan, Novemb. 25.

THE Abbot *Poria* is arrived here from *Rome* with the Cap for the Cardinal *d'Alemcastro*; Great Inquisitor of this Kingdom. The Count *de Villar Mayor*, Ambassador Extraordinary from our King to the Elector Palatin, to demand in Marriage the Princess *Mary Sophia* his Daughter, intends to begin his Journey for *Hydelberg* the 8th of the next month.

Madrid, Decemb. 8. The Cardinal *Du-razzo* had the last week his first Audience of the King. The *Pragmatica* about the Money begins to be put in execution; The Pistoles are to go now for 40 Silver Reals, and other Pieces proportionably. The Emperor's Ambassador has acquainted the King with the News of the taking of *Segedin, Five Churches*, and other places in *Hungary*.

Milan, Decemb. 4. The Count *Onoffe Campori*, Envoy from the Duke of *Modena*, to Compliment the Count *de Fuenfalida* upon his coming to this Government, made yesterday his Publick Entry into this City. The Duke of *Mantua* arrived here this day from *Genova*, being accompanied with a great many Persons of Quality, who went from hence to meet him. The Marquis *de los Balhaces* is arrived at *Castelleto*.

Lemberg, Novemb. 29. The Court is expected here this week from *Zolkiew*, where we hear several Councils have been held about the Affairs of *Moscovy*. The Czar's Ambassadors refuse to enter into any Conference, till they have had their Audience; And the Commissioners whom the King had appointed to adjust with them the Difficulties arisen concerning the execution of the League lately concluded at *Moscov*, are gone to *Zolkiew*, to give his Majesty an account thereof. These Ambassadors have Orders, after they have performed their Commission at this Court, to go to *Vienna*. The King has not yet named the Person to be employed in the Embassy to the Sophy of

Persia. The great Men of *Lithuania* insist to have the next Dyet meet at *Grodno*. An Envoy is arrived here from the Chant of *Tartary*, accompanied with Deputies from the Prince of *Valachia*, to treat about the exchange of Prisoners taken during this last Campaigne.

Warsaw, Decemb. 12. We have an account from *Zolkiew*, that the Senate having, to express their respect to the Prince, the King's eldest Son, and the Regard they have for his Valorous Actions during the last Campaignes, desired he might be introduced into the great Council; He had accordingly assisted in the said Council the 2d Instant for the first time, taking his place on the King's Left-hand. It's reported that a *Turkish* Envoy is arrived at *Caminnec*, being sent to the King of *Poland* with Proposals of Peace. They say the Grand Signior offers to yield to him *Caminnec*, and the whole *Ukraine*.

Buda, Decemb. 14. We have an account that the *Turkish* Troops are moving towards *Essecke*, with a design, as is thought, to put Succors into the places they have left in *Lower Hungary*, which we have the more reason to believe, for that we are assured they have caused a great many Boats laden with all sorts of Ammunition and Provisions, to be drawn up the *Danube* by Men and Horses from *Belgrade* to *Essecke*; at which last place they have likewise provided Materials to make a Bridge over the *Danube* for a Communication with *Temeswaer, Great Waradin, &c.* We are farther told, That they have reinforced the Garrison of *Valpo*, situated on the other side of the *Drave* over against *Siclos*; And that the Grand Visier, after having given these, and such other Orders as he thought necessary for the security of the *Turkish* Garrisons on that side, was parted from *Belgrade* for *Constantinople*, whither the Grand Signior had called him, to direct the Preparations for the next Campaigne. They write from *Zalnocke* and *Segedin*, that Lieutenant-General *Carassa* had so ordered the Quarters for the Imperial Troops under his Command, that it was not feared the *Turks* would be able to put any Succors in, to *Agria, Great Waradin, or Montgat*, although they had advice that the Enemy had very considerably reinforced the Garrisons

Ions of *Temiswaber*, *Lippa*, *Giula*, and *Jenno*, not only to preserve those places, but likewise to disturb the *Imperialists* in their Quarters, and to relieve the places before mentioned. The same Advices say, That the Princess *Ragotzi*, not thinking herself secure at *Montgatz*, had taken a resolution to retire from thence with her best Goods, under a Guard of 3 or 4 hundred chosen Men of that Garrison: To which some other Letters add, that the *Imperialists* had had a Rencounter with a Party that came from that place to Convoy some Woman of Quality, but tell us no Particulars. General *Cassaffia* is gone towards the Frontiers of *Transilvania*.

Kasibonne, Decemb. 20. The Letters from *Vienna* give an account, that the *Turks* do very earnestly solicit a Peace, offering to yield to the Emperor all *Hungary* as far as the *Drave*; To the Crown of *Poland*, *Caminiec*, and all *Podolia*; And to restore *Candia* to the *Venetians*, provided they quit the places they have taken in the *Marex*; These Proposals have, it's said, been sent by the Emperor to his Ambassador at *Rome*, to know his Holinesses Sentiments upon them.

Strasbourg, Decemb. 23. This week passed through this place a *French* Officer, who was going to the new Fort on the *Rhine*, called *Fort Louis*, of which he is made Governour. The late high Waters have, it's said, done some Damage to the Bridge and Fortifications of *Hannin-gen*.

Cologne, Decemb. 28. The Troops of the Circle of *Westphalia*, now in Garrison here, mounted yesterday the Guard for the first time. Levies are making in these Parts for the Service of the Electoral Prince Palatin. They write from *Nuremberg*, that the Elector of *Bavaria* parted from *Munich* the last week for *Insprucke*, from whence it was believed he would go to *Venice*, to pass the Carnival in that City.

Postdam, Decemb. 25. The Electoral Prince of *Brandenburg*, who has been very ill, recovers every day. Lieutenant General *Schoning* arrived yesterday at *Berlin*, and the Troops he commanded in *Hungary* this Summer, are marched from *Crossin* to their Winter-quarters. Colonel *Podewils*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of *Hanover*, had this day his Audience of Leave of our Elector. Preparations are making for the Celebration of the Marriage of the Prince of *Mecklenburg* with the Princess of *Brandenburg*.

Hamburg, Decemb. 27. The Dukes of *Zell*, *Hanover*, and *Wolfenbuttel*, have

had a meeting at *Bardorf*, and, it's said, they have resolved to make some new Levies, especially the Duke of *Hanover*, to recruit his Troops in the Service of the Republick of *Venice*. The Baron *d'Herwart* the Imperial Minister, who has resided here some-time, has taken his Leave of the Magistrates of this City, in order to his return to *Vienna*. We have advice that the *Suedd* Troops which served in *Hungary* the last Campaign are arrived at *Breslaw*; They are to winter in *Pomeran* and *Bremen*.

Paris, Jan. 1. The Cardinal of *Furstemberg* arrive here this Week from *Germany*; He will receive the Cap from the King's Hand, with the Ceremonies practised on the like occasions. The Letters from *Mar seilles* tell us, They had Advice by a Vessel arriv'd in that Port from the *Levant*, that Monsieur *Girardin*, Ambassador from this Crown at *Constantinople*, had been oblig'd by Reason of the Plague which rages there very violently, and the Fear the were in of some Popular Commotion; to leave that City, and to retire to a House near the *Black Sea*, on the side of *Asia*. They write from *Genoa*, that the Duke of *Lorraine* was pass'd privately through *Bologna* in his Journey to *Loreto* and that it was believed he would go from thence to *Rome*. We are told from *St. Mala*, that the Ships which lately arriv'd there from *Cadix*, were not so Rich as was expected, for instead of Millions of *Livres*, which it was thought the Lading would have amounted to, it did not exceed 8 Millions. There was lately an *Alger* Man of War cast away on the Coast of *Brita* but the Men all escap'd.
