THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at St. Petersburg, enclosing an extract from the Journal de St. Petersburg, containing a notice of the Custom House Regulations to come into force in the present month, upon Odessa ceasing to be a free port, of which the following is a translation :

1. At the expiration of the period during which the city of Odessa enjoys the privilege of a free port, and which expires on the 15th of August of the present year, the port will come within the regulations of the General Customs Tariff of the Empire.

2. All foreign merchandize which shall be found at that date in the port of Odessa, and has not paid import duties at the rates of the tariff of the free port, will be forced to pay the full rates of the General Tariff, or will be allowed to be re-exported for the space of one year.

3. The system of Custom House inspection actually in force within the limits of the free port will continue on the same footing until a new order appears.

4. With regard to foreign merchandize delivered by the Custom House of Odessa, after the affixing of a stamp, and intended for exclusive consumption within the limits of the free port, which may still be in circulation in the commerce of the town of Odessa, and which, under the terms of the General Tariff regulations, will be subject to the Custom House stamp, the merchants of Odessa will have the right of presenting the list until the 15th August next, to the Chief of the Odessa Custom House district, for the purpose of having it stamped. After that date all merchandize not declared, and which may be found in commercial circulation without the protection of Custom House stamps, will be confiscated, according to the terms of the general regulations.

5. The right of warehousing for an unlimited period ceasing at Odessa with its extinction as a free port, the right of warehousing for the period of one year will be instituted on the same terms as at the ports of St. Petersburg, Riga, and Archangel.

3. From and after the 15th August the payment of a fifth part of the produce of the import duties, which has been levied at Odessa upon foreign merchandize for the benefit of the town of Odessa, will cease.
