Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Berne, reporting that the Swiss Federal Government have reduced the import duties upon meat, bacon, sausages, and sewing silk, of British produce or manufacture, if accompanied with a certificate stating them to be of British origin, to 3*l.* 50*s.*, per quintal, and that all articles intended for transit through Switzerland should be accompanied with a similar certificate in order to be admitted at the lowest rate of duty.
