And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Saint Martin, in the county of Leicester, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry held in the said parish, after public notice in that behalf, on Thursday the twenty-ninth day of October last, it was resolved,—

“That the Churchwardens be authorized to
“make an application in writing to the Poor
“Law Commissioners to make an Order,
“under their Seal of Office, that so much of

ARTICLE 1. That so much of the aforesaid Act, passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the hold-

"ing of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, "and for regulating the appointment of Vestry "Clerks," as relates to the providing of a Room for the purpose of holding Vestry and other Meetings for the transaction of any business of, or relating to, the said parish, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Saint Martin.

ARTICLE 2. That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
