#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 9.) SEA OF MARMORA—CONSTANTINOPLE.

##### *Alteration of Light at Seraglio Point.*

THE Director of Lights for the Turkish Government has given notice, that after the 25th of December, 1857, a light, described as follows, would be substituted for the fixed light hitherto shown at Seraglio point, at the entrance of the Bosphorus or Channel of Constantinople.

The new light is a fixed light, varied once a minute by *green flashes* preceded and followed by a short eclipse, and visible at the distance of 15 miles from N.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E., round easterly to W.S.W.

The illuminating apparatus is catadioptric of the fourth order.

The light tower is 147 English feet in height, and stands at 547 yards to the eastward of the old one.

##### *Fixed Red Lights at Leander Tower.*

Also, that after the same date two harbour lights would be exhibited from Leander tower, on the western or outer edge of Leander bank, Skutari.

The lights are *fixed red* lights, vertical, and placed at an elevation of 36 feet above the water; they should be visible in clear weather at a distance of four miles.
