WHEREAS the population of the Liberty of Saffron-hill, Hatton-garden, and Ely-rents, in the county of Middlesex, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas, at a meeting of the Vestry of the said liberty, held in the Board Room of the Holborn Union Workhouse, after public notice on that behalf, on Tuesday the 11th day of August last, it was resolved,— "That an application be made to the Poor Law

And whereas the Overseers of the Poor of the said liberty have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution,

Now, therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct :--

ARTICLE 1.—That so much of the said Act, passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within, the said Liberty of Saffron-hill, Hatton-garden, and Ely-rents.

ARTICLE 2.— That a salary of twenty-four pounds per annum shall be paid to the Vestry Clerk for the time being, appointed under the authority of the above mentioned Statute and this Order, by the Overseers of the Poor of the said liberty.

ARTICLE 3.—That the salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual feast days in the year, namely, Lady-day, Midsummerday, Michaelmas-day, and Christmas-day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators, in case he shall die while holding such office.

ARTICLE 4.— That the said Vestry Clerk shall perform the following duties over and above those prescribed by the said Act ; that is to say,—

To take all necessary proceedings for obtaining the due appointment of the Overseers for the liberty.

To assist the Overseers in estimating the amounts necessary to be raised for Poors Rates and other local rates levied by them.

To make out the rates raised under the Metropolis Local Management Act, and to procure the same to be allowed, and to give all notices thereof required by law, and to prepare and countersign the Rate Receipt Book.

To make out, keep, and enter the accounts of the rates raised under the Metropolis Local Management Act, and to attend the auditing thereof.

And we do dereby order and direct, that a copy of this order shall be published in the London Gazette.
