I AM directed by the Officiating Agent, Governor-General for Central India, to acknowledge the receipt of your circular letter, No. 4372, dated the 3rd ultimo, and to forward for submission to the Right Honourable the Governor-General in Council, a return of Europeans and their families who fell victims to the mutineers during the outbreak at Gwalior, Indore, and Mhow, prepared according to the prescribed form.

2. A more complete statement of Europeans killed and wounded by the hands of rebels, will be furnished in the course of a short time, or as soon as particulars are received on the subject from other military stations subordinate to this agency.
