Genoua, January 21.

E have an account of the death of Cardinal Raggi, who died the laft week at Ravenna. It's faid the Pope has declared Signior Mgoftino Imperiale General of his Gallies. We have

Advice from the Levane, That the Plague con-tinues to rage very violently at Confrantinople; and that the fcarcity of Provisions encreases daily, by section most of the Veffels bound thither with Prowitions from Ezypt, Smirna, and Candia, fall into the hands of the Christian Privateers who Cruife in the Archipelago. That the principal Miniflers of the Port do all they can to obtain a Peace, as the only means to re-establish the Affairs of that Empire; but at the fame time do not neglect to make the neceffary Preparations for the supporting the War, in cafe their Propofals of Peace fhould be rejected ; And that the chief Officers of the Seraglio have largely contributed to the Expense thereof. By a Veffel from Tumis we are informed, that they were fitting out there three great Brigantines to Cruife, in thefe Seas.

Venuce, January 24. The preparations for the next Campagne are carried on by this State with the greatest application imaginable. The Towns of the Terra Firma arc required to raile a certain number of Foot; Brefcia is to furnish 600, Bergamo 300, Verona 800, Vicenza 500, Rouiga 100, and the others proportionably, befides which, the Governors of the feveral places have directions to raife what Men they can for the Service of the Republick, which with these and the other Levies that are making by order of the Senate, will have an Army of above 30000 Men in the Field the nextSummer. The Prince of Hanouer, who came lately from the Morea, where he Commanded the Forces of Brinftricke, now in the Service of this State, is going home, but with a refolution to return hither against the next Campagne. We have advice by a Veffel which arrived here this week from the Morea, that Captain General Morofini continued at Napoli di Romania, greatly advancing, by his prefence, the new Fortifications on the Hill Palamida, and the other Works that are making for the fecurity of that City. That Signior Venier was gone to cruife with a Squadron of Men of War in the Archipelaga., And that the Serafquier of the Morea was returned to Corinth from vifiting the Turkish Garifords in the Moreg. The Letters from Dalmaria, tell us, that the Morlaques had again made an incursion into the Edemies Country, and had brought back good store of Booty. The Elector of Banagia, the Duke of Mantua, the Prince of Savoy, and the Prince of Brandenburgh Bareit are arrived here to pass the Carnaval in this place.

Madridi, Jan. 16. The King that hamed the Marquis de Cogolludo to go his Ambaffador to the Pape. The Count de Melgue, late Governor of Milane, continuos under his Confinement. The Count d'Aguslan General of the Fleet, and the Duke de Veraguas General of the Gallies of Spain arrived here this week. The Count de Villarmayor, Amballador from the King. of Portugal to the Electon Palatin, after having flay'd two days at Abcala de Heptanes, continued his Journey towards Barcelona. It has been published at Cadiz and Seville, that the New Spire Flect will depart in the month of February though, it's thought, it will be April hefore they can be ready. The Council will, in few days, name a now Viceroy; of Paru in the place of Don Melabior de Navarra

Lemberg, Jan. 4. Since the Ratification of the League with the Mascovines, there has bardly palfed a day without fome Conference or other, either with the Ambaffadors o regulate feveral matters concerning the execution of the Treaty, or among the chief Commanders of the Army, to order the Preparations for the Campagne, at which latter the King is for the molt part prefent. The Envoy from the Cham of Tartary is fail here; he has made fome Overtures for a Peace, but they e been rejected. An Envoy is coming hith r on the fame Errand from the Turks, and there is no doubt he will have the fame Success. The Envoy the King is fending to relide at Mefcon, will begin his Journey thither very fuddenly. The News continues that the Collacks, in the Service of this Crown, have defeated a Convoy of Provisions that was going to Caminiec.

Vienna, Jan. 26. The Popes Nuncio at this Court, having by an Express from Rome received an account that the Ambaffador of France had declared to his Holinefs, that the King his Mafter, to preferve the Peace of Chriftendom, was willing to change the Truce into a perpetual Peace, provided it be concluded before the end of March, has thereupon had twice Audience of the Emperor, and feveral Conferences with his principal Ministers, after which he dispatched an Express to the Popes Nuncio at the Court of France, A House is preparing here for the Moscowite Amhalfadors, who are expected in few days, their Secretary being already arrived, to give an account of the Number of their Attendance, and to fettle fome matters about their Reception. The Letters from Five Churches of the 14th instant tell us, That Major General Elumgen, Governor of that place, being informed that the Imperial fte had in their late Excursion left two great Mills standing in the Neighborhood of Sigeth, where the Garifon, as well as the Inhabitants, did grind all their Corn , had fent

l'enf dut 400 Horfe, under the Command of Ine Sieur Orlich, who burnt the faid Mills, and between 50 and 60 Houfes that flood thereabouts, having beat back the Tarks that fallied upon them out of the Caftle. Our Advices from the Ottoman Territories affuré us, that the Tarks make great Preparations for the next Campagne, and that the Grand Signior will command in Perfon his Army in Hungay.

Ratisbonne, Jan. 24. The 17th Instant; the Deputies of the Elector of Mentz, Director of the Empire, proposed to the Diet, to deliberate upon the Points that concern the execution of the Truce; The feveral Colledges have been fince affembled upon this Subject, but have not yet 'taken any Refolution in the matter. The States of Franconia are feparated, but with a Refolution to meet again at Naremberg the 15th of the next month. The last Letters from Hungary told us, that the Garifon of Alba Regalis feeing the Convoy of Money and Provisions, which they had fo long expected, did not arrive, grew very mutinous; And that the Spahi's going in a Body to the Baffa, had declared to him, that if they were not very fuddenly paid what was due to them, and supplied with Provifions, they would abandon the place; and that the Bafla had thereupon fent Deputies to Belgrade, to halten the Succors. Other Letters fay, That the Firks were drawing together near Effecke, and that they had prepared a great Convoy for the Relief of Alba Regalis, Sigeth, and Canifa. The Imperial Garifons on this fide the Drave are likewife in fome want of Provisions, the Country round them being fo ruined, that they cannot be supplied from thence, and therefore a Convoy will be fent to Five Churches and Copolivar from Stiria. The Count de Noftitz the Imperial Minister at Stockholme, has concluded a Treaty, in purfuance of which, the King of Sueden is to affift the Emperor the next Campagne with 3000 Men.

Hamburgh, Jan. 30. The Magistrates of this City have lately raifed a Company of Grenadiers, and 100 Gunners, and have ordered foveral Houfes to be pulled down which flood too near the Outworks of the Town. The Count de Roye, who lately commanded the King of Denmark's Forces, is gone to Postdam, to make the Elector of Brandenburgh a Visit. A Regiment of Horfe, and another of Foot, are raising in the Country of Lunenburgh, as is faid, for the Service of the Republick of Vemice. The Letters from Poland. tell us, That the King had written Circular Letters to the feveral Palatinates, containing the Reasons upon which he had refolved not to call a Dyet this year.

had refolved not to call a Dyet this year. Paris, Febr. 8. The Court returned yesterday from Marli. It's faid the King will take a Journy to Compeigne prefently after Easter. The Pope's Nunclo had a long Audience of the King on Sunday last. The Officers of the Marine have Orders to repair forthwith to their feveral Ports. We are told from Rome, that the French Ambassador had had a fecond Audience of the Pope, upon the fame Subject he had his former. The Duke de Crequi continuer very iN.

Whitehall, Febr. 4. This Evening the Body of the Lady Ann Sophia was privately Enterred in the Vault of the Royal Family in King Henry VII's. Chappel, having been received at the Welt-gate of the Abby by the Lord Bishop of Rochefter Dean of Westminster, and the Prebendaries, attended with the Quire, with the usual Coremony.
