Mr. McLoor	... Assistant - Surveyor in Colonel Shortrede's Revenue Survey	Kooldarmah, near Murree	Sept. 3	Shot through the ankle on the morning of the 3rd September, while dislodging a party of rebels from the top of the Kooldarmah Hill 2. Not quite recovered when leaving the station
