Hague, Febr. 11. The 8th Inftant the Heer Yan Dyckvelt, Envoy Extraordinary to His Majefty of Great Britain, took his Leave of the StatesGeneral; And yefterday he parted from hence for Rotterdam, where he Embarqued this morning. The Elector of Brandenburgh has written a very preffing Letter to the States-General, on the Subjeet of the Differences depending between his Subjects and the African Company of thefe Countries, upon which they have appointed fome of their Deputies to éxarthine this Matter, and to make a Report, In order to the bringing it to a fpeedy Conclufion. The Conferences are ftill continued at Maeftricht, between the Commifioners of this State and thofe of Leige, with great appearance of an amicable Accommodation. The States of Utrects have agieed to the ftate of the War for the prefent year, as 'twas formed by the Council of State; And it's believed the States of Holland will likewife confent to it at their next meeting.

Hagie, Felr. 14. The States of Holland reaffembled the 12 th Infant ; They have, it's giid, after a long Debate, refolved to let part of the Cuftoms to farm. The Deputies of the Admiralties, and thofe of the Wef-india Company are returned hither; the fint to receive further directions about the fitting out the Ships defigned againft the Algerines; and the others to renew their Conferences with the Brandenburgh Minifters. The States of $\tau_{t r e c h e}$ have fent Deputien hither, to confer with thofe of the States of Holland about the repairing the Muyder-Bike, which is a matter that occafions fome difpute between the two Provinces; They, had yefterday Audience of the Prince of Orange, and this day of the States of Holkand. We received two days ago the ill News of the lofs of a Ship of 50 Guns belonging to Zealand, which in her return home from Spain with feveral Merctant Ships under her Convoy, taking Fire by come accident in the Powder-Room, was blown up, having on Board 150 Men , and great Riches 18 well in Merchandize as Money.

Rott.rdam, Febr. 12. This day arrived here a Vefiel, the Mater whereof reports; That he came from Cadiy the 3 d of the laft menth with feveral other Merchant Ships, under the Convoy of a Man of War belonging to Zealand, commanded by Captain Martentri, and carrying 50 Guns; That being about 70 Leagues from the Lands End of Englawd, on the 28th patt, the faid Ship was, about 7 in the Evening, blown up by her own Powder, of all the Seamen and Paflengers thrat were on Board her,only two Perfons being faved, who could give no account how this fad Acrident happened.
