HE Pope being pretty well recovered of his Indisposition, which lasted almost two Months, the 8th Instant was, appointed for the Publick Audience of the Earl of Castlemaine, Ambassador Extraordinary from His Majesty of Great Britain. The 14th Inftant his Excellency invited all the Prelates of Rome to Dinner ; The Entertainment was very magnificent, and all things were performed with that Order, that the like has hardly been feen before.

Vienna, Jan. 30. The Letters from Upper Linngay fell us, that the Turks continue to draw their Broops together on she other fide of the Theyffe, for the Relief of Agrial which place, as we are alfund by the Deferters, is seduced to great Extremats. The Spanifla Ingenier who was Wounded at the Siege of Burnand has been ill ever fince, dyed here two days ego. The Mofcaure Ambafladors aro inservet arrived.

"Gologue, Febr. 7: "The Heer Van Haxhuyfen, Buveys Extraordinary first the King of Denmark, who went from hence the laft week to Bonne, had yefterday. The Listers from Menzy, of the 5th Inflato, 'tell usy that the Marquis de Bouffleri, Kovetnor Dh. Laxemburgh, having flaid thermatwo days, during which time he thad feverall Addiences of his filectoral Hightels, was returned too his Government.

Humburgh, Eelman, The Letters from Poland tell us, that the Amballadors of Mufcow intended to part from Lemberg the 18th of the last month, on their Jourdey bor Ficeila. They write from Stockholme 10f the Zylin balt, that thereing was gone to Coningsbry, topail a weeksor Loldays there and hind that he had given Orders for the railing a Regiment of Foot, which is to be called the Guards of Prince Charles. The Regiment that's raifing in the Country of Lunenburgh for the Service of the Republick of Venice, will be commanded by Prince Maximilian of Brunswicke.

Hague, Febr. 11. The 8th Inftant the Heer Van Dyckvelt, Envoy Extraordinary to His Maje-fty of Great Britain, took his Leave of the States-General; And yesterday he parted from hence for Rotterdam, where he Embarqued this morning. The Elector of Brandenburgh has written a very pref-fing Letter to the States-General, on the Subject of the Differences depending between his Subjects and the African Company of these Countries, upon which they have appointed fome of their Deputies to examine this Matter, and to make a Report, in order to the bringing it to a speedy Conclusion. The Conferences are still continued at Maestricht, between the Commissioners of this State and those of Leige, with great appearance of an amicable Acconimodation. The States of Usrecht have agreed to the ftate of the War for the prefent year, as 'twas formed by the Council of State; And it's believed the States of Holland will likewife confent

to it at their next meeting. Hague, Febr. 14. The States of Holland reaffembled the 12th Inflant; They have, it's faid, after a long Debate, refolved to let part of the Cuftoms to farm, The Deputies of the Admiralties, and those of the West-India Company are returned hither; the first to receive further directions about the fitting out the Ships defigned against the Alguerines; and the others to renew their Conferences with the Brandenburgh Ministers. The States of Utrecht have fent Deputies hither, to confer with those of the States of Holland; about the repairing the Muyder-Dike, which is a matter that occasions some dispute between the two Provinces; They, had yesterday Audience of the Prince of Orange, and this day of the States of Holland. We received two days ago the ill News of the lofs of a Ship of 50 Guns belonging to Zealand, which in her return home from Spain with feveral Merchant Ships under her Convoy, taking Fire by some accident in the Powder-Room, was blown up, having on Board 150 Men, and great Riches as well in Merchandize as Money.

Rost. rdam, Febr. 12. This day arrived here a Vefiel, the Maßer whereof reports ; That he came from Cadig the 3d of the last month with feveral other Merchant Ships, under the Convoy of a Man of War belonging to Zealand, commanded by Captain Martentz, and carrying 50 Guns; That being about 70 Leagues from the Lands End of England, on the 28th patt, the faid Ship was, about 7 in the Evening, blown up by her own Powder, of all the Seamen and Paffengers that were on Board her, only two Perfons being faved, who could give no account how this fad Accident happened. The Lading of this Ship is valued at above 40000 pound Sterling.
