TURKISH LIGHTHOUSE DUES.

Board of Trade, Whitehall, June 29, 1858.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Constantinople,

notifying that the collection of the fixed Turkish lighthouse dues on all steamers and sailing ships of friendly powers, passing thoough the straits of the Dardanelles and the Bosphorus, was to commence on the $\frac{1}{2}$ June instant, and that, should any masters object to the payment of these dues, the quarantine authorities would not visé their bills of health.

Northern Lighthouses. NOTICE TO MARINERS. · Cantickhead Lighthouse.

THE Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses hereby give notice, that on the night of Thursday, the 15th day of July next, and every evening thereafter, from the going away of daylight in the evening, to the return of daylight in the morning, a light will be exhibited from Cantickhead Lighthouse, the position and characteristics of which have been specified by Messrs. David and Thomas Stevenson, the Engineers to the Board, as follows:

Cantickhead Lighthouse is situated on the headland of that name on the south-eastern extremity of South Walls, Island of Hoy, in Orkney. The tower, which is 60 feet in height, will, together with the keepers' houses, be painted white.

The light will be a catadioptric second class Holophotal Revolving White Light, showing a flash once every minute. It will be elevated about 115 feet above high water of spring tides, and will be seen in clear weather about 16 nautic miles, and at lesser distances according to the state of the

The Commissioners further give notice, that by Order in Council, dated the 7th day of May last, the following tolls are authorised to be levied in respect of the said lighthouse, viz. :-
