The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the fifty-ninth ycar of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four, section sixteen ; of an Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine, section three; of an Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter sixty, section one; and of an Act of the nincteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, section one; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council, a representation, bearing date the twentieth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fiftyninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four, section sixteen; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine, section three; of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter sixty, section one; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, section one; have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Philip, situate in Arlington square, in the parish of Saint Afary, Islington, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Philip, situate in Arlington-square aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Archibald Campbell, Bishop of London, testified by his having signed and sealed this representation, we of Frog-lane, and extending thence westward

humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Saint Mary, Islington, and also all that part of such parish known as Saint Stephen's District, Islington, which are described in the Schedule hereunto annexed, all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto also annexed, should be assigned to the said church, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Philip, Islington.'

"And with the like consent of the said Archibald Campbell, Bishop of London, testified as aforesaid, we further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect thereof should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing. Representation has reference.

"All that part of the parish of Saint Mary, Islington, and of that portion of the said parish which now forms the district chapelry of Saint Stephen, Islington, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, which is bounded on the north by the Lower-road, on the west by the district chapelry of Saint Peter, Islington, on the south by the parish of Saint Peter, Islington, on the south by the east in part by the district chapelry of Saint Matthew, Islington, and in other part by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary between the said districts of Saint Stephen and Saint Matthew, at a point in the middle of the New Northroad, which is opposite to the middle of Southstreet, and extending thence north westward along the middle of such last-named street, to the middle of Frog-lane. and extending thence westward
