

## NAVAL PRIZE MONEY.

*Department of the Accountant-General

NOTICE is hereby given to all persons interested therein, that preparations are now making for the intended distribution of proceeds arising from the Greek brig Panaghia di Rhombri, captured on the 27th November, 1855, by Her Majesty's ship Dauntless.
