And Her Majesty is further pleased, by and with the advice aforesaid, to direct that the forms given in Schedules A and B to the said Act annexed, may and shall be so altered as to make the same applicable to the said Court of Record, and the Judge and Deputy Judge thereof, instead of to Her Majesty's Superior Courts at Westminster, and the Judges thereof; and that the costs mentioned in the first section of the said Act shall be fixed by the Registrar of the said Court of Record, subject to the approval of the Judge thereof, and that the Judge of the said Court, or any Deputy or Assistant Judge thereof, shall and may, as to the said Court, exercise all the power given by the said Act to any Judge or Judges of the Superior Courts at Westminster, in or by the first, second, third, and fourth sections thereof.
