Board of Trade, Whitehall, September 13, 1858.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Lisbon, enclosing copy of a Portuguese Royal Decree, reducing for a period not to exceed the end of May, 1859, the import duty on foreign rice, to 600 reis, per 100 lbs. weight, and permitting during a similar period the free importation into the kingdom of Portugal of grain of all kinds and of all sorts of leguminous seeds.
