(No. 71.) SHETLAND ISLES—WHALSEY GROUP.

#### *Revolving Light on Out-Skerries.*

THE Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses have given notice, that on the night of the 1st December, 1858, the present temporary light on the island of Gruna, Out-Skerries, will be discontinued, and on and after that date a *revolving white* light, attaining its greatest brilliancy once *every minute*, will be exhibited from the permanent light tower erected on the Bound Skerry.

The light is placed at an elevation of about 145 feet above the level of high water, and should be visible in clear weather from the deck of a ship at a distance of about 17 miles.

The light apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, and of the first order.

The light tower is 80 feet high, and painted white, and the whole height of tower and lantern is 99 feet. The Bound Skerry is the most easterly rock of the Out-Skerries group, on the east side of the Shetland isles.

### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 72.) AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

#### *Light on Cape Borda.*

WITH reference to Notices to Mariners, Nos. 40 and 66 of 1858, information has been received at the Admiralty that the light on Cape Borda, the north-west point of Kangaroo Island, off St. Vincent Gulf, South Australia, has been exhibited since the 13th of July, 1858, and is designated the Flinders Light.

The light, which *revolves* showing alternately *red* and *white* every half minute, is visible between N.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. round by the north and west to S.W. by S. The white light may be seen in clear weather from a distance of 30 miles, but the red light not more than about half that distance, and when the red light is not distinguishable the white light will appear at intervals of one minute.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors, and of the first order.

The lighthouse is a square tower of stone, and stands about 500 yards from the edge of the cliff in lat.  $35^{\circ} 45\frac{1}{2}'$  S., long.  $136^{\circ} 34\frac{1}{2}'$  East of Greenwich.

*Directions.*—Vessels approaching Cape Borda from the south-west should keep the light well open of the high land to the southward of the cape to avoid the reef off Cape Bedout, the western extremity of the island, and if bound up Investigator Strait, after having rounded Cape Borda, they should keep the light quite clear of the high land to the eastward of it on a S.W. by W. bearing until Cape Forbin is passed, when it may be shut in.

In proceeding down Investigator Strait the light should not be brought to bear to the westward of S.W. by W.

(No. 73.) MEDITERRANEAN—COASTS OF SICILY, ILLYRIA, AND GREECE.

#### *Alteration of Light at Augusta.*

THE Sicilian Government has given notice, that on and after the 1st of November, 1858, the fixed light at present shown from Fort Avola, in the harbour of Augusta, on the east coast of Sicily, will be replaced by a light *revolving* once in three minutes, at an elevation of 90 English feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 14 miles.

#### *Light at Trieste.*

The Imperial Central Maritime Government at Venice has given notice, that on and after the 4th of October, 1858, a new light would be exhibited from the lighthouse on Santa Teresa Mole, Trieste, when the fixed light shown during the alteration of the illuminating apparatus would be discontinued.

The new light is *intermittent* every half minute, the period of brightness lasting 8 seconds, and it may be seen in clear weather from the distance of 13 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, and of the third order.

#### *Grippo or Negropont Channel.*

The Greek Government has given notice, that the Negropont channel, between Eubœa or Egrippo, and the mainland, having been deepened to the uniform depth of 18 feet English, is now re-opened for navigation.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament, in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill to alter, amend, extend, and enlarge the powers and provisions of an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the fourth, intituled "An Act for repairing the road from the city of York to the top of Oswaldkirk Bank, in the county of York," and to continue and extend the term granted by the said Act, and any further term granted by subsequent Acts of Parliament in extension of the original term, or to repeal the first-mentioned Act, and to create a further term with reference to the said road, or some part thereof; and powers will be applied for in the said Bill, to levy the same, or new tolls, rates, or duties on the said road, to alter or vary existing tolls, rates, and duties; and to confer,

Fishguard Harbour Improvement.  
(Incorporation of Company; Construction of Harbour and Pier, &c., at Fishguard; Power to levy Tolls, Rates, and Duties; Power to borrow Money on credit of Tolls, and to lease the same.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament, in the ensuing session, for an Act for the following purposes, some or one of them (that is to say):

1st. To incorporate a Company for the purpose of constructing and maintaining (on the lines, or within the limits of deviation referred to in the plans hereinafter mentioned) a harbour, with a pier or jetty, with quays, wharves, slips, and other works, with all approaches and conveniences thereto, within the port or harbour of Fishguard, in the parish of Fishguard, in the county of Pembroke (which pier or jetty will commence at a certain point known as Penmaen-Ivor, the property of Sir James John Hamilton, Baronet, and Lady Hamilton, in the parish of Fishguard aforesaid); and for the purpose of making, forming, and constructing a road and quay, in extension of the present quay, in the said town of Fishguard, from the south end of the public house numbered 4 on the plans hereafter mentioned, to the point known as the Fort or Castle Point, within the parish of Fishguard aforesaid; and for deepening and otherwise improving the said harbour.

2nd. To enable the said intended Company to divert, alter, stop up, temporarily or permanently, all roads, navigations, streams, and watercourses within the limits of the said works.

3rd. To enable the said intended Company to purchase by compulsion or agreement, or otherwise, and to hold all lands, tenements, wharves, shores, quays, and other property whatsoever required for the purposes of the said works, and to alter, vary, or extinguish, all rights and privileges therein which would in any manner impede or interfere with the due and proper construction, maintenance, or use thereof.

4th. To enable the said intended Company to take tolls, rates, rents, and duties, or otherwise to charge vessels and merchandize for the use of the said harbour and works; and more particularly to authorize the levying of a tonnage rate of not more than three pence per ton on all vessels taking in or discharging cargoes in the said harbour of Fishguard (that is to say) between the Castle Point, commonly known as the Fort Point, to the eastward, and the Head, known as the Saddle Point, to the westward of the town of Fishguard, in the parish of Fishguard, in the county of Pembroke, and a tonnage rate of not more than half the said sum on all windbound vessels taking refuge inside the said pier and works, or within

the limits of the proposed Act. Also a tonnage rate of not more than one penny per ton on all vessels discharging limestone or culm within the limits of the proposed Act, and to alter and vary such rates, and to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from payment of tolls, rates, or duties, and other rights and privileges, and to raise money upon the credit of the said tolls, rates, and duties, and of the undertaking, for the purposes of the said harbour and works, and to let to farm the said tolls, rates, and duties.

5th. To incorporate with the said intended Act all or some parts of "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," and "The Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847."

#### Mid-Sussex and Arundel and Littlehampton Junction Railway.

(Construction of Railway from the Coultershaw Branch of the Mid-Sussex Railway to the towns of Arundel and Littlehampton; Incorporation of Company; Working Arrangements with the Mid-Sussex and London, Brighton, and South Coast Railway Companies; Amendment of Acts.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament, in the ensuing session, for an Act to incorporate a company for the construction and maintenance of the several railways, tramway, stations, and works following, or some or one of them, with all proper conveniences and accommodations connected therewith (that is to say):

Firstly. A railway, commencing by a junction with the Coultershaw branch of the Mid-Sussex Railway, in or near a field, in the parish of Hardham, in the county of Sussex, numbered 15 on the Parliamentary plan of the said branch railway, and terminating by a double junction with the London, Brighton, and South Coast Railway, in the parish of Leominster, in the aforesaid county, the junction of the western branch of the fork being at a point about thirty-two yards to the east-

ward of the bridge by which the said London, Brighton, and South Coast Railway crosses the River Arun, and the junction with the eastern branch of the fork being at a point about one mile to the eastward of the said bridge; which said intended railways and other works will pass from, in, through, or into, or be situated within, the several parishes, townships, and extra-parochial, or other places following, or some of them (that is to say), Hardham, Coldwaltham, Greatham otherwise Gritham, Amberley, Bury, Houghton, North Stoke, South Stoke, Burpham, Warningcamp, Leominster, Arundel, Rustington, and Littlehampton, all in the said county of Sussex.

Secondly. A tramway, commencing by a junction with the said first-named railway, at or near the point where it crosses the Brighton and Arundel turnpike-road, in the said parish of Leominster, about 800 yards to the eastward of the river bridge at Arundel, and terminating on the east bank of the River Arun, at or near a point about 330 yards below the Arundel Bridge, in the parish of Arundel, and passing through the aforesaid parishes of Leominster and Arundel.

Thirdly. A branch from the said first-named railway, commencing by a junction with the same, in the said parish of Leominster, at the point where the forks of the double junction of the said first-named railway with the London, Brighton, and South Coast Railway diverge, and terminating at or near the Littlehampton Gas Works, in the parish of Littlehampton, and passing through the aforesaid parishes of Leominster and Littlehampton.

Fourthly. And by the said Bill power will be taken to divert, by means of a cut or channel, a part of the navigable course of the River Arun, which diversion, cut, or channel will commence at a point of the said river, about six furlongs below the bridge at South Stoke, and will terminate at a point on the said river about two and a half furlongs above the public house called the Black Rabbit, all in the parish of South Stoke, in the said county of Sussex.

And powers will be taken in the said Act for the following purposes, or some of them (namely):

To stop up, divert, or alter, whether temporarily or permanently, all such turnpike or other roads, highways, railways, and tramroads, canals, streams, navigations, or rivers within the said parishes, townships, and extra-parochial or other places, or any of them, which it may be necessary to stop up, divert, or alter, by reason of the construction of the said intended railways, tramway, and works, or some or one or any of them;

To purchase, by compulsion or otherwise, lands or houses for the purposes of the said intended railways, tramway, and works, or any of them, and to alter, vary, or extinguish all existing rights and privileges connected with such lands and houses, or which would in any manner impede or interfere with the construction, maintenance, and use of the said proposed railways, tramway, and works, or any of them, and to confer other rights and privileges; to levy tolls, rates, and duties, for or in respect of the said proposed railways, tramway, stations, and works, or any of them, and to confer such exemptions from the payments of such tolls, rates, and duties as may be expedient;
