

Public Buildings, to acquire, by compulsory purchase or otherwise, certain houses, tenements, and other buildings and hereditaments, in the parish of St. Benet, Paul's-wharf, in the city of London, bounded on the north by Great Knightrider-street, on the east by Benet's-hill, on the south by St. Benet's Church-yard, Church-court, and the property extending from thence through Helmet-court to Addle-hill, and on the west by Addle-hill; and more particularly described and shewn on the plans hereinafter mentioned, and, notwithstanding any existing application or user thereof, to pull down and remove the same, and appropriate the sites thereof; and also the courts, yards, gardens, and other spaces of ground described on such plans within the boundaries aforesaid, for the purposes of the Court of Probate and the principal registries and other offices connected therewith; and also for the purposes of such other courts and offices necessary for the public service, and in such manner as shall be prescribed by the Lords Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury, or by the said intended Act.

And notice is hereby further given, that duplicate plans, describing the situation of the houses, tenements, and other buildings and hereditaments, so proposed to be purchased, with a book of reference thereto, containing the names of the owners and lessees, or reputed owners and lessees; and of the occupiers thereof, and also a copy of this notice, as published in the London Gazette, will, on or before the 30th day of November instant, be deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the city of London, at the Sessions House, in the Old Bailey; and that on or before the same day a copy of the said plan, book of reference, and Gazette notice, will be deposited with the Parish Clerk of the said parish of St. Benet, Paul's-wharf, at his residence.

Westminster New Bridge.

(Western Approach.)

Powers to Commissioners of Her Majesty's Works and Public Buildings to acquire additional space in Bridge-street and New Palace-yard, Westminster.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament, in the session of 1859, for an Act to vary, extend, enlarge, or repeal, and re-enact all or some of the powers and provisions of an Act passed in the 16th and 17th years of the reign of Her present Majesty, called "The Westminster Bridge Act, 1853." and to enable the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Works and Public Buildings thereby incorporated, to acquire, by compulsory purchase or otherwise, certain houses, tenements, and other buildings and hereditaments, as shewn upon the plans hereinafter referred to, situate on the south side of Bridge-street and in New Palace-yard, or elsewhere, in

the parish of Saint Margaret, Westminster, in the county of Middlesex, and to pull down the same and appropriate the sites thereof; and also the ground described on such plans, whether now used as ways, streets, yards, vacant ground, or otherwise, for the purposes and in furtherance of the objects contemplated and authorized by the said "Westminster Bridge Act, 1853."

And it is proposed by the said intended Act to empower the said Commissioners to stop up any streets, ways, paths, or passages, which now lead into or pass through, over, or by the side of the property so proposed to be acquired by them as aforesaid, or any part thereof; and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges in any manner connected therewith.

Scarborough Gas.

(Increase of Capital; Amendment of Act; and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament, in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):

To repeal, alter, amend, and enlarge some of the powers and provisions of "The Scarborough Gas Company's Act, 1851," or wholly to repeal the said Act, and to consolidate all or some of the provisions thereof, and of the said intended Bill into one Act, and to confer upon "The Scarborough Gas Company" (herein called the Company) such existing, and also further and additional powers.

To enable the Company to raise additional capital by the creation and issue of additional shares and by borrowing on mortgage or bond, and to prescribe the mode of issue of such additional shares amongst the shareholders, or the sale thereof by auction or otherwise, and the rate of dividend to be attached thereto, and either with or without a preference in the payment of such dividend, or any other special privilege or advantage.

To reserve, if so deemed expedient, the rights of holders of shares in the already authorized capital of the Company, by way of preference, dividend, or otherwise, over the additional capital to be created by the Bill.

To make further provisions with respect to the constitution and management of the Company, and to the share capital, and the regulation and augmentation of such capital.

To vary or extinguish all rights, privileges, or exemptions which would interfere with the objects
