### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 85). MEDITERRANEAN—COAST OF SIGILY AND GREECE.

#### Red Light at Port Messina.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 65, of 1858, information has been received at the Admiralty that the light shown on and after the 1st of October, from the western extreme of Fort Campana, of San Salvatore, at the entrance of the Port of Messina, in Sicily, is a fixed *red* light, and not white as previously reported.

### Lights in the Gulf of Patras.

Information has also been received at the Admiralty that a lighthouse has been erected a little to the westward of the entrance to the Misolonghi Lake, on the northern shore of the entrance to the Gulf of Patras, western coast of Greece, and exhibits a fixed white light, which may be seen in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

The lighthouse stands N.W. by W. ¼ W. 6 miles from Bakari Point, and in about lat. 38° 19¼' N., long .21° 23¼' East of Greenwich. The entrance to Misolonghi Lake is at Fort Vasilade,

whence the boat passage to the town of Misolonghi, is marked by beacon bushes on both sides,

Also, that a fixed red light is shown from a lighthouse on the extremity of the mole at the town of Patras, but it is so faint as to be made out with difficulty when approaching the anchorage at night.

#### Mole at Katakolo.

Also, that a mole has recently been constructed at the village of Katakolo, in Katakolo Bay, on the eastern side of the cape of the same name,

west coast of the Morea,

The mole is well built, and extends 210 yards in an E. by N. direction, to a depth of 5 fathoms, and affords shelter within to vessels up to 500 tons burthen. Vessels generally lay a bower anchor to the northward, and moor astern to stone bollards on the mole. A smaller mole or quay, for landing cargoes from boats, projects from the village of Katakolo, at a quarter of a mile farther to the northward.

(No. 86.) ATLANTIC-UNITED STATES.

Light at Cherrystone Inlet, Chesapeake Bay.

THE United States Lighthouse Board has given notice, that on and after the 1st of January, 1859, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the bar at the entrance of Cherrystone Inlet, on the eastern shore of Chesapeake Bay, Virginia.

The light will be a fixed white light, illuminating 270° of the horizon, placed at an elevation of 36 feet above the water, and should be visible in ordinary weather from a distance of 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be dioptric, or

by Fresnel lenses, and of the fourth order.

The lighthouse is a screw pile structure; the house is painted white, and the piles and lantern red. It stands in about 4 feet water at low tide, on the west side of the entrance to the inlet, and in lat. 37° 15½' N. long. 76° 3' W. of Greenwich, according to the United States Coast Survey.

### Light at Stingray Point.

Also, that on and after the same date a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse erected off Stingray Point, the south point of entrance to the Rappahannock River, on the western shore of

Chesapeake Bay, Virginia.

The light will be a fixed white light, illuminating all round the horizon, and visible in ordinary weather from a distance of 7 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is a Fresnel lens of

the sixth order.

The lighthouse is a screw pile structure, similar in all respects to the above at Cherrystone Inlet. It stands in 6 feet of water, at about one mile east of the point, and in lat. 37° 33½ N. long.

76° 16′ 40" West of Greenwich, by the United States Coast Survey, with Windmill Point lightvessel E.N.E. (true) distant 4 miles.
