## TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by Warrant, under their hauds, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage, payable by law, on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant.

And whereas further powers are given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by another Act of Parliament, passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the post-office."

And whereas certain powers are also given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by another Act of Parliament, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Stamp duties on Newspapers, and to provide for the transmission by post of printed periodical publications."

And whereas it is expedient that regulations should be made for the transmission by the post, of the letters, newspapers, and packets hereinafter mentioned.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers reserved to us in and by the said herein-before recited Acts and every of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided, order, direct, and declare, as follows:

1. On every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to the Republic of Paraguay, or posted in the Republic of Paraguay, addressed to the United Kingdom, and transmitted by the post between any part of the United Kingdom and any place in the Republic of Paraguay, via Buenos Ayres, or any other port or place in the Argentine Confederation (the sea conveyance being by British packet boat), there shall be charged and taken an uniform rate of postage of sixpence.

2. On every letter, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, transmitted by the post between the Republic of Paraguay, and any of Her Majesty's colonies or any foreign country, through the United Kingdom, via Buenos Ayres, or any other port or place in the Argentine Confederation (the sea conveyance between the United Kingdom and the Argentine Confederation being by British packet-boat), there shall be charged and taken a British rate of postage of sixpence for the conveyance of every such letter between the Argentine Confederation and any part of the United Kingdom, and for the conveyance of every such letter between the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet or ship conveying the same, and the colony or foreign country to or from which the same shall be forwarded, such a further or additional rate of postage, as shall from time to time be charged and payable for British postage, on letters not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted or delivered at the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival
