The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HER Majesty in Council was this day pleased to declare the Right Honourable Granville George, Earl Granville, K.G., Lord President of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and his Lordship took his place at the Board accordingly.

This day the Most Honourable George William Frederick, Marquis of Ailesbury, the Right Honourable Sir William George Hylton Jolliffe, Bart., the Right Honourable James Wilson, and the Right Honourable Thomas Emerson Headlam, were, by Her Majesty's command, sworn of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took their respective places at the Board accordingly.

Her Majesty in Council was this day pleased to deliver the Great Seal to the Right Honourable John, Lord Campbell, whereupon the oath of Lord Chancellor of Great Britain was, by Her Majesty's command, administered to him; and his Lordship took his place at the Board accordingly.

Her Majesty having been pleased to deliver the custody of the Privy Seal to the Most Noble George Douglas, Duke of Argyll, the oath of

Keeper of the Privy Seal was this day administered to him, and his Grace took his place at the Board accordingly.

Her Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Most Noble Henry Pelham, Duke of Newcastle, the Right Honourable John Russell (commonly called Lord John Russell), the Right Honourable Sidney Herbert, the Right Honourable Sir Charles Wood, Bart., and the Right Honourable Sir George Cornwall Lewis, Bart., to be Her Majesty's five Principal Secretaries of State, they were this day, by Her Majesty's command, sworn Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State accordingly.

Her Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable William Ewart Gladstone, Chancellor and Under Treasurer of Her Majesty's Exchequer, the usual oath was this day administered to him.

Her Majesty in Council was this day pleased to declare the Right Honourable George William Frederick, Earl of Carlisle, K.G., Lieutenant-General and General Governor of that part of the United Kingdom called Ireland.

Her Majesty in Council was this day pleased to appoint the Right Honourable James Wilson to be President of the Committee of Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, in the absence of the President of the said Committee for the time being.
