NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Board of Trade, Marine Department, September 1, 1859.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Foreign Plantations have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, through Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Vienna, the subjoined copy of a translation of a Notice to Mariners, warning them not to anchor their vessels in the neighbourhood of the New Electric Cable between Sicily and the coast of Calabria.

Translation.

The following notice has been transmitted to us by the direction of the Central Electric Telegraph in Sicily, and we publish it for the guidance of navigators:—

“ Navigators are informed that two electric cables unite Calabria to Sicily. The points of immersion on the Sicilian Coast are the Tower of Ganzirri, at the entrance of the Phase, and the citadel of Messina. On the Tower of Ganzirri the words ‘Royal Electric Telegraph’ are written in black letters on a white ground, and during the night a green signal light is kept burning.

“ The present notice is given in order to prevent all approach or anchorage in the vicinity of the above-named points.”
