LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

ORDER ON APPEAL: DAWLISH, DEVONSHIRE.

WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1858, was adopted by the parish of Dawlish, in the county of Devon, on the 30th day of June, 1859, and notice of such adoption was duly given in writing to Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Home Department as required by such Act; and whereas it was also duly certified to the Secretary of State aforesaid that a copy of such notice was advertized for three successive weeks in one of the local newspapers, published and circulated in the aforesaid parish, and that copies of such notice had also been affixed to the principal doors of each church and chapel in such parish to which notices are usually affixed. And whereas a petition was presented to the Secretary of State aforesaid, signed by owners of property and ratepayers of the said parish, praying that the said Act should not be adopted in the said parish, or if adopted by any part, that it should only be adopted within such portion thereof as forms the town of And whereas the said Secretary of Dawlish. That the Local Government Act, 1858, be not adopted by the whole of the parish of Dawlish aforesaid.
