the dignity of a Knight of the United Kingdom  
of Great Britain and Ireland unto Bryan Edwards,

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto  
Alexander John Joseph Teleki, a Count of the  
Holy Roman Empire, a naturalized subject of Her  
Majesty, as Alexander Count Teleki de Szék, and  
to Jane Frances his wife, only daughter and heir  
of Henry, Lord Langdale, deceased, by Jane Eliza-  
beth his wife, eldest daughter of Edward, Earl of  
Oxford and Earl Mortimer, and sister and co-  
heir of Alfred, late Earl of Oxford and Earl Mortimer,  
both deceased, her royal licence and authority,  
that they may respectively take upon themselves,  
and henceforth use the surname of Harley only in  
lieu of that of Teleki, and also respectively bear  
the arms of Harley only, and that such surname  
and arms may in like manner be taken, borne,  
and used by the issue of their marriage ; such  
arms being first duly exemplified according to  
the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's  
Office, otherwise the said royal licence and per-  
mission to be void and of none effect :

And also to command, that the said royal con-  
cession and declaration be recorded in Her Ma-  
jesty's College of Arms.
