

CONTRACT FOR TELESCOPES.

Department of the Storekeeper-General of the Navy, Somerset-Place, December 23, 1859.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that on Tuesday the 3rd January next, at two o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying Her Majesty's Dockyard, at Woolwich, with

300 TELESCOPES,
