**N**OTICE is hereby given, that The Queen will hold a Court at St. James's Palace, on Wednesday, the 7th of March next, at two o'clock, for the special and exclusive reception of Officers of Volunteer Corps, who may be desirous of presenting themselves before Her Majesty.

**REGULATIONS** to be observed at the Volunteer Court which will be held by Her Majesty, at Saint James's Palace, on Wednesday the 7th of March, 1860.

The Officers of Volunteer Corps who are desirous of attending the Queen's Court, at Saint James's Palace, on Wednesday the 7th of March next, should forthwith communicate their intention to the Lord Lieutenants of the several Counties in which their Corps have been established.

A list of the Officers who have thus signified their wish to be present will be transmitted by the Lord Lieutenant of each County to the Secretary of State for the War Department.

These lists, which will distinguish the rank of each Officer and the Corps or Company to which he belongs, will be forwarded to the Lord Chamberlain from the War Department, at latest, upon Monday the 5th of March.

The Lord Lieutenants and the Military Authorities summoned to attend the Court, will enter the Palace at the Entrée Entrance in Ambassadors' Court, and will pass at once to the Entrée Room.

The Officers of Volunteers will enter the Palace at the usual Corridor Entrance, opposite Marlborough House, and will be shewn at once to the room appointed for the assembling of their corps, where they will form into Companies in the order in which they are to pass the Queen. In order to facilitate this arrangement, each Officer will furnish himself with a card on which is distinctly written, his County, the number of his County in the Army List, and the name and number of his Corps, Company, or Sub-division. *Artillery* should be specially marked on the cards of Officers of Artillery Volunteer Corps.

The doors of the Palace will be opened at half past twelve o'clock, and no Officer can be admitted after a quarter before two o'clock.

Officers will appear in the Uniforms approved for their Corps by the Lord Lieutenants.

They will pass before the Queen by Regiments, Companies, or Sub-divisions, headed by the Senior Officer present.

The Officers of each Corps will be introduced by the Lord Lieutenants of their Counties, who will join them before entering the Throne Room. In the absence of the Lord Lieutenants, they will be introduced by the Under Secretary of State for the War Department. The Officers will draw up in line before the Queen, and the Senior Officer of each Corps or Company present, will hand a card\* containing the names of those about to pass before Her Majesty, to the Lord Lieutenant. This Card will be passed to the Lord Chamberlain, who will read the names to the Queen. The Officers will then pass on.

The various Corps will take precedence according to their Seniority in the Army List.

## REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED WITH REGARD TO THE QUEEN'S LEVEES AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command.*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

\* Cards proper for this purpose may be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, either upon personal or written application. The Senior Officer of each Corps or Company will write upon one of these Cards the names of the Officers who will be present, and this Card he will take to the Reception.

## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half-past one o'clock.

## ADDRESSES.

The same regulations apply to the presentation of Addresses or Petitions.

A card containing a statement of the object of the Addresses or Petitions, with the names of the persons who are to present them, must be sent to the Lord Chamberlain's Office two clear days before the Levee. Two other cards, containing similar information, are to be taken to the Levee, one to be delivered to The Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to the Lord Chamberlain, who will read its contents to The Queen.

On these occasions no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

A Deputation to present an Address is not to exceed four persons.

The members of a Deputation, who have not previously attended Court, must be presented to The Queen.

*By Her Majesty's Command.*

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards,

with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen, for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no Presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half-past one o'clock.

## CHAPTER of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle.

*At the Court at Buckingham Palace,  
March 2, 1860.*

A CHAPTER of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle having been summoned for this day, the following Knights Brethren, in their Mantles and Collars, assembled in the Green Drawing-room; viz.:

The Duke of Roxburghe, the Earl of Mansfield, the Earl of Elgin and Kincardine, Lord Panmure, and the Marquess of Ailsa, attended by the undermentioned Officers in their Mantles, and wearing their Chains and Badges; viz.: Sir John Stewart Richardson, Baronet, Secretary of the Order, and Frederic-Peel Round, Esq., Gentleman Usher of the Green Rod.

At three o'clock the Knights Brethren were called over by the Secretary, when (Her Majesty and His Royal Highness the Prince Consort having passed into the Chapter-room,) they proceeded, with the Officers of the Order, into the presence of the Sovereign.

The Queen being seated in Her Chair of State, and His Royal Highness the Prince Consort at the table on the right hand of Her Majesty, the Sovereign was pleased to command the other Knights Brethren to take their seats at the table, according to their seniority in the Order, the Officers of the Order standing at the bottom of the table.

The Sovereign was then pleased to signify Her Royal Pleasure touching the election of a Knight into the Order; whereupon the Knights Brethren

proceeded to the election, and the suffrages having been collected by the Secretary (commencing with the Junior Knight), were by him, kneeling, presented to the Sovereign, who was pleased to declare that the Right Honourable James, Earl of Fife, had been duly elected a Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle.

Then, by command of the Sovereign, the Earl of Fife was received at the door of the Chapter-room by Lord Panmure and the Marquess of Ailsa, the two Junior Knights Brethren present, and conducted between them to Her Majesty, preceded by the Secretary (bearing the Ensigns of the Order upon a velvet cushion), and by the Gentleman Usher of the Green Rod.

The Sword of State being thereupon delivered to The Sovereign, the Earl of Fife kneeling near The Queen, was knighted therewith; after which his Lordship had the honour to kiss Her Majesty's hand; the Earl of Fife rising, the Oath was administered to his Lordship by the Secretary.

The Earl of Fife, then again kneeling, and the Secretary on his knee, presenting to Her Majesty the Riband and Jewel of the Order, The Queen, assisted by His Royal Highness The Prince Consort, the Senior Knight, was graciously pleased to place the same over his Lordship's left shoulder.

His Lordship having again kissed the Sovereign's hand, and after receiving the congratulations of the Knights Brethren, retired.

The Chapter being ended, the Knights Brethren were, by command of Her Majesty, again called over by the Secretary, and, with the Officers of the Order, retired from the presence of the Sovereign with the usual reverences.

And also to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
