And whereas, at a meeting of the Vestry of the said township held at the Town's Office, Broad-street, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Thursday the twenty-sixth day of January last, it was resolved,-

"That the Poor Law Board be requested to "isue an Order under their Seal of Office, "directing that the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850 (13 & 14 Vict., c. 57), enti-"tled 'An Act to prevent the holding of " Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, " and for regulating the Appointment of "'Vestry Clerks,' shall be applied to and put in force within this township, so far " only as relates to the providing of accom-" modation for holding Vestry Meetings."
