

CONTRACT FOR SHOES.

Department of the Comptroller for
Victualling and Transport Services,
Somerset-House, July 26, 1860.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of
Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom
of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby give notice,
that on Thursday the 9th August next, at half
past one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with
such persons as may be willing to contract for
supplying and delivering into Her Majesty's
Victualling Stores at Deptford, Gosport, and
Plymouth,

Shoes, 35,550 pairs, Deptford; 21,500 pairs,
Gosport; 28,500 pairs, Plymouth; one-third
of each quantity to be delivered in two
months, another third in three months, and
the remainder in four months from the date
of contract, or earlier if preferred by the
party tendering.

*Tenders may be made for the whole or any
portion of the shoes.*

*Their lordships reserve to themselves the power,
when the tenders are opened, of contracting either
for the whole, or for such part thereof only as
they may deem fit, or for a greater quantity, or
of not contracting for any.*

*No tender will be received unless made on the
printed form provided for the purpose and which
may be obtained on application at the said office,
at the Victualling Yards at Gosport and Plymouth,
or to the Officer conducting the Packet Service at
Liverpool, or to the Collector of Customs at Bristol.*

*Separate tenders must be made for each place,
and no attention will be paid to any offer not so
made.*

office, and also at the Victualling Yards at Gosport
and Plymouth.*

*Particular attention is called to the recent modi-
