

the amount next thereafter payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister making the vacancy or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister succeeding to such district: Provided always, that if it shall appear to us to be expedient at any future time, that instead of the annual sum then in course of payment by us to the minister of the said district, or instead of any part of such annual sum any land, tithe, or other hereditament, should be conveyed or secured to such minister and his successors in fee, nothing herein or in any other scheme contained, shall prevent us from recommending and proposing such a substitution.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted, and of the nomination of the minister thereof, shall, without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Algernon, Duke of Northumberland, his heirs and assigns, and by the said dean and chapter of the said cathedral church of Durham, and their successors for ever, in manner hereinafter mentioned; that is to say: that the said Duke and his heirs and assigns shall have and enjoy two nominations of a minister to the said district for every single nomination by the said dean and chapter and their successors, and that the first two of each three nominations to such district shall be vested in and belong to, and shall and may be exercised by the said Duke, his heirs and assigns.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of SOUTH CHARLTON, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Alnwick, in the county of Northumberland, and diocese of Durham, forming that part of the township of Hulne Park which is situate to the north and east of an imaginary line extending along the middle of the turnpike road called the Alnwick and Eglington road.

"And also all that part of the parish of Ellingham, in the same county and diocese, which is comprised within the township of South Charlton."

And whereas a draft of the said scheme has, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the said parishes of Alnwick and Ellingham (out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken), and such incumbents and patrons have severally consented to the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law

immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Durham.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council,

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council, a scheme bearing date the twenty-third day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Chigwell, in the county of Essex, and diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of Chigwell herein after mentioned and described (such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship), should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"And, whereas certain tithes or rentcharges in lieu of tithes, arising, issuing, and payable out or in respect of certain lands and hereditaments situate within the said parish of Chigwell, have become vested in us under the provisions of the said first-mentioned Act.

"And, whereas the Reverend Richard Laurence of Marchings, in the said parish of Chigwell, clerk, has paid to us the sum of one thousand and five hundred pounds, upon the understanding that we should forthwith appropriate towards the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted the tithes or rentcharges in lieu of tithes which are specified in the first Schedule hereunto annexed, forming part of the tithes or rentcharges in lieu of tithes so vested in us as aforesaid, and that we should recommend to your Majesty in Council that the first nomination of a minister to the said district should be assigned to the Reverend Richard French Laurence, treasurer of the Cathedral Church of Cashel, in Ireland, as the nominee of the said Richard Laurence.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Joseph Cotton, Bishop of Rochester, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme,) we humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Chigwell, which is described in the second Schedule hereunto annexed, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto also annexed, shall, upon and from
