THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the Moniteur, containing an Imperial Decree, providing that the Articles of British Origin or Manufacture enumerated in the Treaty of Commerce, of January 23rd, 1860, between Her Majesty and the Emperor of the French, when imported into France in other than French or British vessels, shall be subject to an additional duty of 25 centimes per 100 kilogrammes in those cases where the duty is less than 3 francs per 100 kilogrammes, or where the Article is admitted free of duty under the French or British Flag; and to the additional duties provided for by Article VII of the Law of April 28th, 1816, in those cases where the duty is equal to or exceeds 3 francs per 100 kilogrammes.

NOTE.—The additional duties provided for by the above-mentioned Article of the Law of 1816 are as follows :—

10 per cent. on the first 50 francs of duty.
5 per cent. on the remainder of the duty up to 300 francs.

The portion of the total duty levied that exceeds 300 francs is exempt from additional duty.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF PARTS OF ACT BY THE SOUTHPORT COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS at a Meeting of the Commissioners acting under and by virtue of the Southport Improvement Act, 1846, duly held at the Town Hall, in Southport, in the county of Lancaster, on the 16th day of October, 1860, pursuant to the requirements of such Act, it was resolved that such parts of the Local Government Act, 1858, as are hereinafter specified, be adopted within the limits prescribed by the aforesaid Southport Improvement Act, that is to say, sections 1, 4, 12 (Subdivision 2), 13 (Subdivision 1), 15, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24 (Subdivision 2), 27, 28, 34 (Subdivisions 2 and 4), 38, 42, 45 (Subdivision 6), 49, and 61, of the aforesaid Local Government Act, 1858. And whereas notice of the adoption of the hereinbefore recited parts of the said Act has been duly given, in writing, to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as aforesaid, do hereby give notice, that the hereinbefore recited parts of such Act have been duly adopted within the limits prescribed by the Southport Improvement Act, 1846, under the jurisdiction of the Commissioners acting under such Act, and that in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, the several parts of the last hereinbefore recited Act will, from and after the passing of the aforesaid resolution adopting the hereinbefore recited parts of such Act, have the force of law within such limits, of Southport, as aforesaid.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No 35.) AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

Alternating Light near Cape St. George.

THE Pilot and Steam Navigation Board of Sydney have given notice, that on and after the 1st day of October, 1860, a light would be exhibited from the lighthouse recently erected on a prominent headland, situated about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles northward of Cape St. George, and $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles southward of the south point of entrance to Jervis Bay, East coast of Australia.

The light is an *alternating* light, showing consecutively a *red*, *green* and *white* light at intervals of *thirty seconds*. It is elevated 224 feet above the level of high water, and is visible seaward when bearing between S.S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. and N. It is seen as far as N. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., over a sloping

hill situated south of the lighthouse; but then a vessel must be a considerable distance to the southward of it. In entering Jervis Bay the light will be eclipsed by Bowen Island, forming the south point of entrance, when bearing S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.; and it will only be visible from a portion of the bay, between the bearings of S.S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. and S.E. The white light will be seen in clear weather at a distance of about 19 miles, and the green and red lights at 14 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors of the third order.

The light tower is 61 feet high, built of white stone, and stands in latitude $35^{\circ} 9' 16''$ S., longitude $150^{\circ} 47' 8''$ East of Greenwich.

Directions.—Vessels approaching Cape St. George from the southward, should always endeavour to make this light, to avoid being embayed in Wreck Bay, the deep indentation westward of the Cape. The light will first open over the sloping hill to the southward of it, bearing N. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E.; caution must, however, be observed in nearing the cape, which is a low, dangerous, rocky point, on which the sea breaks. When within the distance of about 8 miles, the light should not be brought to the northward of N. by W.; for if the vessel should be near the land, to the southward of this bearing, the light will be partially, if not wholly obscured, but by standing to the eastward it will gradually open out, and when bearing N.N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. it may be passed with safety at a distance of from one to two miles.

In approaching from the northward the light will open of Crocodile Head, bearing S.S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., and by keeping it in sight a vessel will pass the Head in safety at a distance of from one to two miles.

Jervis Bay affords good and safe anchorage in all winds.

NEW SOUTH WALES.

EAST COAST OF AUSTRALIA—LIGHT HOUSE NEAR JERVIS' BAY.

The bearings given are magnetic, the distances are in nautical miles, and the variation is $10^{\circ} 15' E.$

A white stone tower has been erected on a prominent headland, situated $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of the southern bluff (Bowen Island) of Jervis' Bay, and 2 miles north of the projection known as Cape St. George, on the coast of New South Wales, from which a light will be exhibited on and after the 1st of October next.

The tower is 61 feet high, and the centre of the light will be 224 feet above high water level, and will be visible in all directions of the horizon from

north $27^{\circ} E.$, round by the eastward to south $0^{\circ} 40' W.$

It will also be visible $19^{\circ} 52'$ further to the westward over a sloping hill, situated to the southward of the light-house, but only when at a considerable distance to the southward of the same.

The light is on the catoptric principle of the third class, and revolving, exhibiting at intervals of 30 seconds, a red, green, and white light alternately.

The intensity of the white light is visible from an elevation of 16 feet, in clear weather, at a distance of 20 miles, while its green and red rays vanish at a distance of 15 miles.

The Latitude is $35^{\circ} 9' 15'' S.$, and
the Longitude $150^{\circ} 47' 48'' E.$

Vessels coming from the south, will open this light over the sloping hill to the southward of it, on a bearing of north $20^{\circ} 32' E.$; caution must, however, be observed in approaching Cape St. George (a low, dangerous, rocky point, on which the sea breaks), and when within a distance of 8 miles, or thereabouts, the light should not be brought to bear to the northward of north $10^{\circ} W.$, as, when a vessel is near the land, to the southward of this bearing, it will be partially, if not wholly, obscured, but by standing to the eastward it will gradually open out, and when bearing north $25^{\circ} W.$, or N.N.W. $\frac{1}{4} W.$, it may be passed with safety at a distance of from one to two miles.

Vessels from the southward should always endeavour to make this light, so as to prevent being embayed in the deep indentation lying to the westward of the cape designated "Wreck Bay."

Vessels approaching from the northward will open this light clear of "Crocodile Head" on a bearing of south 27° west, and by keeping it in view may pass in safety to the south, at an offing of from one to two miles.

Vessels entering Jervis' Bay (a good and safe anchorage in all winds) will shut the light in with the north end of "Bowen Island," on a bearing of south $\frac{1}{2} W.$
