NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE following Despatch has been received at the Board of Trade from Her Majesty's Consul at the Cape de Verd Islands:

(Copy.)

British Consulate, Saint Vincent, Cape Verd No. 5. Islands, November 22, 1860. Sir.

I HAVE the honour to report, for the information of the Board of Trade, that the white hulk, Ocean, belonging to Messrs. Visger and Millers, and used as a coal depôt in this harbour, has been, by order of the Local Government, removed further into the bay, towards the south side of it. It is important that this information should be made public, because Masters of vessels accustomed to frequent this port, and who are not aware of this change, may mistake their position and run aground. The following are the compass cross bearings, taken by Lieutenant R. M. Gillson, R.N., of the present position of the hulk, viz.: Flag-staff of fort, N.N.E., church, E. and by S. ½ south. Variation allowed 17° 46' west, and the depth of water at low tide is 16 feet.

- 4. Opposition at the hearing can only be made by the Creditor in person, or by Counsel appearing for him.
