(No. 41.) MEDITERRANEAN - SICILY.

Revolving White Light on Favignana Island.

THE Sicilian Government has given notice, that on and after the 24th day of December, 1860, a light will be exhibited from the lighthouse recently erected on Sottile or Mamone point, on the south side of Favignana island, province of Trapani, west coast of Sicily.

The light will be a *revolving white* light, eclipsed every *minute*. It will be elevated 141 feet above the level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 20 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

The position of the lighthouse is given in the Sicilian Notice as lat. 37° 55' 46" N., long. 12° 16' 6" East of Greenwich.

(No. 42.) AFRICA—SOUTH EAST COAST.

Fixed White Light at Mouth of Buffalo River.

THE Colonial Government at the Cape of Good Hope has given notice, that on and after the 25th day of August, 1860, a light would be exhibited from the lighthouse recently erected at the entrance of Buffalo River, East London, South-east coast of Southern Africa.

The light is a *fixed white* light, elevated 45 feet above the level of high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of about 11 miles.

The lighthouse—painted in alternate bands of red and white—stands on the reef at the south side of the entrance of the river.
